ROTARY LICENSE PLATES IN MISSISSIPPI



Senate Bill No. 2167 has recently been introduced by Senator Dean Kirby. The bill should pass without issue. We are currently working on a design that will be unveiled at PETS in Vicksburg.

We must pre-sell 300 MS plates in order to get them produced. If we get this done by May 15, we can have the plates by July 1. The additional cost for a tag will be \$31. Of that \$31, \$24 comes back to the District in which it was purchased. This will be positive exposure for us, as well as a revenue stream for many years to come



Bill then introduced Blake Wilson, Executive Director of the Mississippi Economic Council for today's presentation, Blueprint Mississippi 2001.

LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM SUMMARY

Club members and guests had the opportunity to participate in a number of survey questions through an electronic voting system.

Our responses to a number of questions were compared to the same questions asked of business leaders previously. Sixty-two percent of the business leaders feel as though our children will have to leave the state to find better paying jobs. That percentage was somewhat lower in today's responses. Ninety-two percent of the same business leaders feel as though Mississippi is poised for economic growth in the next ten years. That percentage was lower among our responses. However, our survey participants feel significantly better about this region's ability to compete in the coming years as compared to the rest of the state. Our responses will be combined with responses from twenty other such presentations in the coming months.

Dr. Hank Bounds was then introduced and provided a recap of the goals and objectives of the Blueprint Mississippi 2001 project. Four areas are being researched and developed. The four areas are Education Achievement, Resource Management, Economic competitiveness and Technology and Communication readiness.

Dr. Bounds explained that Blueprint Mississippi 2011 will attempt to benchmark the goals of the 2004 economic development plan and will then stretch those goals into the next decade. The plan will also designate high priority items, make actionable recommendations and assign responsibilities to organizations such as the legislature, businesses, and volunteers. The goal is to provide a rollout of the Blueprint Mississippi 2011 plan by the fall of this year.


