ROTARY LICENSE PLATES IN MISSISSIPPI



Senate Bill No. 2167 has recently been introduced by Senator Dean Kirby. The bill should pass without issue. We are currently working on a design that will be unvailed at PETS in Vicksburg.

We must pre-sell 300 plates in order to get them produced. If we get this done by May 15, we can have the plates by July 1. The additional cost for a tag will be \$31. Of that \$31, \$24 comes back to the District in which it was purchased. This will be positive exposure for us, as well as a revenue stream for many years to come

Special thanks to AG, Rob Smith who has worked tirelessly at the legislature to get this introduced and to get our design underway. PDG, Kay Steed is actually the person that had this idea some years ago. Thanks to both for their contributions to this program.

We will take a count of how many in our club are committed to pre-ordering a MS Rotary license plate.

Jeri Buti spoke about this month's Rotarian Magazine. This issue is a 100th anniversary keepsake edition with a tribute to all the letters and covers spanning 100 years.

Mississippi Senate Bill 2167, which will introduce Rotary license plates, will soon be voted on. In order to get them produced, 300 of them must be pre-sold by May 15th, and the plates would be ready on or about July 1st. An additional cost over the price of a regular license plate is \$31. Out of that money, \$24 will come right back to the District in which the plate was purchased. This creates a new revenue stream AND is a source of positive exposure for the Rotary Club.

Bill announced the January membership statistics. On January 1st, there were 116 members, but by the 28th of the month, we are now down to 113 members. Attendance was 66%, and 34 members had perfect attendance. Bill reminded members to always notify Lamar about make-up meetings to get credit.

LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM SUMMARY

Jerome Brown introduced today's presenters. His childhood included many wonderful memories of going to the U.S.O. Museum in Hattiesburg. That museum, first opened in 1942, originally served as the place that black soldiers stationed at Camp Shelby would recreation. It has been renovated in recent years and turned into the African-American Military History Museum. Jerome introduced various directors in charge of the museum - Latova Norman, Iola Williams, LTC Fred Varnado, Colonel Sheila Varnado, and SFC Charles J. Brown. Mr. Brown, who is Jerome's father, has always had a passion for serving his country and his community.

Charles said that African-Americans have proudly served in every American war from the Revolutionary War up through the Afghanistan War. Well known groups included the Buffalo Soldiers and the Tuskegee Airmen. Hattiesburg native Ruth Bailey Earl served in WWII as a nurse. Another Hattiesburg native, Jesse L. Brown, proudly served as the Navy's first African-American aviator in the Korean War. The Museum shows what it meant for them to be able to serve their nation, even during times of discrimination. They were fighting for the right to fight for all Americans.

The Museum, registered with the National Registry of Historic Places, has seen over 9800 visitors since 2009. The exhibits include many artifacts that tell stories and acknowledge service by many brave African-Americans not included in any history books. There are only two buildings like this in the U.S., and the one in Hattiesburg is the only one available for public access. It is located on East 6th Street off of Main Street downtown and is open from 10am-4pm, Tuesday through Saturday. Come and see a special tribute to Jesse L. Brown, on display from Jan. 13th thru Feb. 26th. Call 601.450.1942 for more information.

Bill thanked SFC Brown for his presentation and then adjourned the meeting with our motto Service Above Self.


