MINUTES FROM 01/11/11

Club President, Bill McLeod, presided over the meeting.

Thank you to Dan Kibodeaux who gave the invocation and to Jaclyn Adams, who led the Club in the Pledge of Allegiance. Bill then led members in the Four Way Test.

Special thanks to our greeters for today, who were Hayden Mitchell and Andrea Hood.

Wes noted that there are no visiting Rotarians and no guest visitors at today's meeting.

It was reported that member Toxey Morris is recovering from his recent medical issues and has now returned home. It was also reported that former member Victor McMullan has been in intensive care twice in the past few weeks. Prayers were requested for both of these individuals and their families.

Bill reported that our club was well represented during this past weekend's mid-year meeting. A number of accomplishments were reviewed. He also reported that Mike Bonnette has agreed to serve as the Scholarship Chair in lieu of John McDaniel's recent resignation. RYLA applications are due by April 1. Anyone interested should contact Mike.

Bill also reported that 14,807 have registered for the upcoming Rotary International Convention to be held next year in New Orleans. Only 160 have registered from Rotary District 6840. Anyone interested in attending is encouraged to register before the March 31, 2011 deadline passes.

Dan Kibodeaux thanked those who are participating and promoting the Reading Between the Lions project. He also requested that anyone interested in reading in the coming weeks sign up on the forms provided at each table.

Scott Hummel thanked Dan Kibodeaux for providing today's Rotary Foundation raffle prize. Mary Cromartie was today's winner.

Maura McLaughlin gave today's classification talk. Maura grew up in Ocean Springs where she and the Clover Club followed Walter Anderson on their bikes and watched the artist at work. She reported memories of playing in the rooms where the walls were painted by Anderson. After attending the University of Southern Mississippi, Maura attended

Ole Miss Law School. She worked for the United States Justice Department before returning to the Mississippi Gulf Coast where she opened her private practice. From Biloxi she relocated to Hattiesburg where she works today. She is married with two children and happy to be a Rotarian. She notes the diversity of Rotary as being an attraction to her.

01/11/11 PROGRAM SUMMARY

Kris King then introduced today's guest speaker, Dr. Ben Carmichael. Dr. Carmichael is a retired cardiologist. He notes that he got into cardiology partly due to a number of heart attacks his father suffered in the late 1940's and early 1950's.

Dr. Carmichael shared his memories of treating General Dwight D. Eisenhower, President and Lyndon Baines Johnson, President. General Eisenhower was in Walter Reed Hospital while Dr. Carmichael worked there. He gave very interesting insights into the personality and character of General Eisenhower. He noted that it was a very sad day at Walter Reed Hospital the day President Eisenhower died. He described the former President as being grateful, kind and a prince of a gentleman.

While serving at Brook Army Medical Center in San Antonio, Texas, Dr. Carmichael also treated former President Johnson. He noted that during the three years he worked on the past president's treatment he never heard him say thanks to anyone who assisted him, including family members. He also noted that Johnson never slept alone in a dark room. He had to have someone assigned to his room at all times while he slept. Johnson died suddenly at his ranch just north of San Antonio and when he arrived at Brook Army Medical Center was pronounced dead on arrival.
