he Rotary Foundation Future Vision Pilot is a three-year test of the new grant structure offered in the Foundation's <u>Future Vision Plan. One hundred districts</u> are participating in the pilot. Pilot districts will have a unique opportunity to help refine the new grant structure by providing input and receiving specialized Foundation support and service.

Grant structure

Pilot districts will work with Rotary Foundation <u>District Grants</u> and Rotary Foundation <u>Global</u>

Rotary Foundation District Grants

District grants are block grants made to districts for up to 50 percent of their District Designated Fund (DDF). District grants offer the flexibility to respond quickly to immediate needs or to plan projects with clubs locally or in other countries.

Rotary Foundation Global Grants

Global grants support large international projects with sustainable, high-impact outcomes in the six areas of focus that correspond to the Foundation's mission.

Areas of focus

- 1. Peace and conflict prevention/resolution
- 2. Disease prevention and treatment
- 3. Water and sanitation
- 4. Maternal and child health
- 5. Basic education and literacy
- 6. Economic and community development



In 2007 supporters raised \$230,000 in four months and purchased 42 acres of land near Purvis. In November 2009 the House Relief Parent's Duplex was completed. Today Homes of Hope serves 15 children.

> Homes of Hope targets younger children and sibling groups who need their services. On the average a foster child changes homes three times every fourteen months in Mississippi.

> Homes of Hope is privately funded. The children attend public school and when they need to visit a dentist or a doctor their model couple takes them. The organization spends on the average of \$34 to \$35 thousand dollars each year on each child in their care.

> pleted Dr. Garrett says the facility will be able to serve 42 children on campus with assistance also being provided to their children who are attending college.

> Garrett invited Rotarians to attend the Homes of Hope Auction which will be held on August 11, 2012 at the Lake Terrace Convention Center.
