

MINUTES FROM 7/20/2010

Club President, Bill McLeod, presided over the meeting.

Thanks to Erik Graham for the invocation and Larry LeBlanc for leading us in the Pledge.

LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

Mike Ratliff then introduced Dr. William Gullung, III a physician at the Dermatology Clinic of Hattiesburg.

Dr. Gullung noted that tanning beds being used today produce ultraviolent "A" light which causes damage to the second layer of the skin. The ultraviolent light from the sun can cause damage to only the first layer of skin. Damage causes aging of the skin and in some cases can cause cancer.

Sunlight is the number one cause of skin cancer in American today. The second is exposure to x-ray. The third cause is traumatic scares and the fourth cause is arsenic. Arsenic was used to treat certain diseases in previous years and some arsenic caused cancers still occur. The majority of skin cancers are known as nonmelanoma, meaning they are not likely to get into the blood stream and affect other systems within the body. There are more than one million basil cell melanomas diagnosed in the United States each year.

Dr. Gullung recommends that everyone screen their body to know where you have moles, sores or other skin conditions. By staying informed of changes, you will be better equipped to decide when it would be advisable to see a doctor.

Skin cancer is the number two cause of death for the 25-35 year old female population. Dr. Gullung recommends that you avoid the sun during the heat of the day (11 a.m. to 3 p.m.). Dress appropriately when out in the sun and use sunscreens to help prevent damage.
