

MINUTES FROM 6/29/2010

President Mary Cromartie presided over the meeting.

Thank you to Steve Ramp, who gave a beautiful invocation and to Richard Topp who led the Club in the Pledge of Allegiance. Mary then led members in the Four Way Test.

Gene Owens introduced today's visitors and guests. Bob Riley introduced both of his daughters, Mary Riley and Christy Riley-Mitchell. Brian Moore brought his guest, Michael Griffin. Bill McLeod introduced his mother, Bebe McLeod, and three of his office team members - Melissa Holder, Terry Foxx, and Brad Stinson. Gene welcomed each of today's visitors and thanked them for showing their support of our past, current and future leaders.

Mary encouraged all Club members to make sure their accounts are paid up-to-date within the next week! It is important that every cause that we have pledged to help is followed through with before the end of this fiscal year. We don't want to let any of them down. Aime Spears reminded everyone that the Polio Plus campaign is still selling raffle tickets and that each member is pledged to contributing \$33 this year. If you have not yet contributed. please do so verv soon and indicate Polio Plus on vour check made out to the Rotary Foundation. Aime then presented 5 tickets to Blue Bayou Water Park in Baton Rouge to auction off at the meeting. The winning bidder was Steve Ramp for \$50 thank you Steve.

Eric Graham reminded members that the Golf Tournament is in four weeks; on July 31st. We have over 100 Club members, and if each member would just recruit one sponsor or one player, this fundraiser will be a great success. All proceeds will go to ARC.

Mary asked all Sustaining Members to stand in recognition. A great number of members stood. Mary thanked them for their generosity. A Rotary Foundation Sustaining Member is a person who contributes \$100 or more per year to the Foundation's Annual Programs Fund. 100 % of all gifts given to the Foundation go to the Annual Programs Fund and are eligible for and count cumulatively toward the Foundation's various recognition programs, including recognition as a Paul Harris Fellow after \$1,000 has been contributed. Two new Paul Harris Fellows were also recognized – Joe Meador and Mary Cromartie.

Bill McLeod spoke about our Club's membership and how it has grown. Mary's membership goal for 2009/2010 was to grow our membership by a net gain of 5 members. He received his B.S. in history from the University Southern Mississippi in 1971, his M.S. in history from US in 1974. and his Ph.D. in history from Memphis Sta University, now the University of Memphis in 1982. held the positions of Director of Oral History and Assist Professor of History, USM from 1982-89; Visiting Assista Professor of History. University of Kentucky from 1991-Associate Professor of History, Delta State University fro 1994-98; and Professor and Chairman of History, D from 1998-2009.
