He later moved to Tylertown and became involved in Dixie Youth Baseball as a coach and as a commissioner. He is active in his church and sings in the choir, teaches

RA's and Sunday School. His hobbies include hunting and fishing. He joined Rotary in 1984 and became president of the Tylertown club. A career change brought him to Hattiesburg. He became an active Rotarian here and served in multiple offices with our club including one term as president. Today's Mystery Rotarian is Freddy Walter.

Today's unannounced Club Assembly was made possible by a mix-up with the original speaker and the committee's inability to find a replacement speaker over the three day weekend.

The Sunrise Club is spearheading an effort to get a Rotaract organization started in the Hattiesburg area. Rotaract brings together people ages 18-30 in universities and communities worldwide to organize service activities, develop leadership and professional skills, and have fun. Rotary clubs sponsor them, but Rotaract members manage and fund their clubs independently. Rotaract members work closely with their local Rotary club, and may join after their Rotaract membership ends. A faculty advisor at the University of Southern Mississippi is needed to make this organization possible. Sean asked our members with USM connections to help find a faculty member who would take on this responsibility.
