MINUTES FROM 03/15/11

Club President, Bill McLeod, presided over the meeting.

Thanks to Mary Cromartie, who gave the invocation and to Gene Owens, who led the Club in the Pledge of Allegiance. Bill then led members in the Four Way Test.

Special thanks to our greeter today, who was Chris Price.

Wes Brooks then welcomed today's guests. Carolyn Lee was a guest of Audra Cummings. Durward Dees was a quest of Chris Price. Terry Martin was a quest of David Owens. There were no visiting Rotarians.

David Owens requested club members to sign up to assist with the water project. The project is a part of Hub Fest and will be held on March 26th. The "Night-In-Italy" event is set for Tuesday, April 19th at Southern Oaks. David handed out a sign-up sheet for the Night in Italy event and encouraged all members to participate.

Bill noted that the board is considering using some or all of the funds from the Water Project to send relief, either Shelter Boxes or participate in a water project for Japan.

Dan Kibodeaux reported that he is in dire need of readers for the Reading Between the Lions project for the months of March and April. A sign-in sheet was circulat-

Thanks to Kristy Gould and Hattiesburg Clinic for providing today's Rotary Foundation Raffle item. Allen Anderson was the winner as announced by Janice Touchstone.

Mary Cromartie noted that award nominations are soon due for Rotarian of the Year, Non-Rotarian of the Year and the Young Rotarian of the Year. She solicited nominations from those in attendance today and will do so again next week. The Awards Committee will meet afterwards to consider the nominations.

Conrad Welker provided today's Classification Talk. Conrad came out of the Army in 1952 and was first employed by the Natchez Public School system. He received his Masters Degree in 1955 and became Principal within the Natchez system. He first joined rotary in 1960. He was employed at the University of Southern Mississippi in 1966 and transferred his membership to the Hattiesburg Rotary Club. He served as the Club's Secretary in 1971 and 72 and participated in the formation of the GSE program. He helped get the first candidate from our club that was accepted, Milton Wheeler. Conrad retired from the education system in 1990. He served as the President of the Hattiesburg Rotary club in 2006-2007.

LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM SUMMARY

Brian Moore then introduced today's guest speaker, Jack Ragsdale. Jack retired from the Tampa Police Department in 2005. He and his wife relocated to the Wiggins area where he has opened a firearms training and competition facility.

Jack asked for a show of hands of gun owners in the room and then a show of hands of those who have concealed weapon carrying permits. He noted that if gun owners were interested in obtaining a concealed weapon license, they should proceed with that interest, noting that the law could change and prohibit weapon carrying permits.

He focused his discussion on firearm safety. He told club members they should always treat a gun as being loaded. He also suggested that a gun only be loaded when you're ready to use it. You should always keep the muzzle pointed in the safest direction. You should also keep your finger off the trigger until you're ready to shoot and then remove it from the trigger immediately.

If you use a gun for self protection he suggested that the gun be stored in a locked gun safe that can be bolted down. If you wish, you can unlock the safe at night to make it easier to obtain the weapon in the event of an emergency. Jack spoke briefly of the Castle Law which gives property owners the right to protect themselves and their property. He noted that the Castle Law extends to one's automobile.

Jack then made available gun safety literature and a gun safety training CD that can be used for children.
