### LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

Gene Owens then introduced today's speaker, Betsy Rowell, Executive Director of the Historic Hattiesburg Downtown Association.

Hattiesburg is celebrating its 125th anniversary with a number of events in the coming months. There will be a birthday party at Town Square Park as a part of the upcoming Hub Fest.

Although 2008 wasn't the greatest financial year in the nation's history, the public investment in downtown Hattiesburg still totaled 6 million dollars. The private investment for the year reached 2.7 million dollars. Since 2000 a total of 42 million in public and 34 million dollars in private money have been spent in the downtown re-development process. A total of eight net businesses with three new ones have been added creating 23 net jobs. Seventeen residential units have also been added to the downtown property list.

Betsy noted that a new wave of excitement was recently generated when steel hit the ground at the Old Hattiesburg High School project. Work continues to shore up the internal structure with the front facade work being completed within the next few weeks. There is now a three-year build-out goal for that project which is expected to bring a larger number of USM students into the downtown community.

Recent purchases and development plans include a renovation of two properties creating three new retail and five new residential units. Additionally, a new micro-brewery is under development in the warehouse district and a new Pine Street Grocery is being created just across from the county's tax office. She also mentioned the YMCA will announce their new downtown location shortly...

If you're looking for entertainment events, Betsy recommends attending Hub Fest, visiting the Farmer's and Artisan's market each Thursday afternoon which will feature a free concert on the third Thursday in April and again in October. The Live-After-Five event is back every Friday evening in Town Square Park during the months of April and October. The weekend of April 16 - 19th will feature a number of events throughout the city.
