Maura McLaughlan reported on her research regarding a possible water project the Club could be involved in following their recent disaster. She noted that the board will continue these discussions at Monday's board meeting. Bill McLeod reminded board members of the Monday, March 28 board meeting to be held in Mike Ratliff's office at the Greater Southern National Bank building on Hardy street.

Dan Kibodeaux reported that he is in dire need of readers for the Reading Between the Lions project for the months of March and April. A sign-in sheet was circulated.

Thanks to Tracie Fowler and the Hattiesburg American for providing today's Rotary Foundation Raffle items. Kris King and Johnny Stevens were winners. Johnny offered his prize for auction. David Toms was the high bidder for the USM baseball tickets.

Robert Cummings gave the board an update on the President Elect's Training Seminar that he attended recently in Vicksburg. He was one of 128 Rotary president elects who attended from this region. He reported on a number of resources that are available to the Club's leadership including the greatest resource of all, networking. Robert reported that our club is one of the largest and is also one of the most involved clubs of all those who attended this year's PETS.

Mary Cromartie asked for member input for award nominations. The input received from members will

be reviewed by the Awards Committee in the very near future.

Condolences were offered to Steve Ramp and his family over the recent loss of Steve's father.

LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM SUMMARY

Brian Moore than introduced Wes Brooks, today's guest speaker. Wes is the Development Coordinator for the DuBard School for Language Disorders at the University of Southern Mississippi.

Wes began his presentation with a video about the school, noting that 2012 will be the 50th year for the DuBard School's operation. The video captured the comments of University officials, DuBard school representatives, a former client and parents of students who have benefited from the school's pro-

Wes reported that one in five Americans have reading difficulties. He also noted that about 50% of Americans cannot read at an 8th grade level and that 85% of all juvenile delinquents have reading problems.

The DuBard School is one of three clinical programs on the USM campus. These programs offer clinical services to those enrolled in the therapy programs as well as teaching and training opportunities for USM students. Additionally, the DuBard School also offers national training programs that are used to introduce and train other clinicians on the DuBard teaching methods.

The DuBard School currently has the capacity for 80 children in the full-time enrollment program. There are 95 on a waiting list for a slot in the fulltime program. The school also offers an out-client treatment service program. This program is a feebased program and can accommodate 38 clients. There are currently 67 on the out-client program's waiting list.

The DuBard School serves 15 counties in this part of the state reaching into 20 school districts. The school focuses its treatment program on children with oral and/or written language disorders. Each child enrolled in the program has an average of 4.89 diagnosis.

THIS WEEKS PROGRAM - USM BASEBALL COACH MICHAEL FEDERICO

If anyone understands the Southern Miss baseball program, assistant coach Michael Federico does. He was a player for the Golden Eagles under Hill Denson from 1995-97 and became a graduate assistant coach under Corky Palmer from 1998-99, helping the Golden Eagles to a NCAA Regional in 1999.

After his stint at Southern Miss, he became an assistant coach under Scott Berry at Meridian Community College in 2000, a team that played in the JUCO world series, and while the head coach at Meridian CC and current Golden Eagle assistant coach Chad Caillet was his top assistant from 2002-2004.

Since leaving Meridian in 2004, he has competed against Southern Miss each season as the top assistant at Conference USA for Memphis.

Prior to joining the Memphis staff in 2004, he was the head coach at Meridian Community College (2002-2004), where he was a two-time Junior College Coach of the Year honoree. In 2003 and 2004, he led his squad to the JUCO World Series.

Federico led MCC to a 46-14 finish and a ninth-place finish lin the JUCO World Series in 2004. Several of his players received accolades following the 2004 season, as two lplayers were named as All-Americans, four players received All-Region 23 honors, and nine Eagles were voted to the All-State team. Federico was named Region XXIII and Southeastern District Coach of the Year.

In 2003, he led the Eagles to a fifth-place finish in the Alpine Bank JUCO World Series. The Eagles also won the MACJC Central Division, Region XXIII and Southeastern Regional Championships. Federico was honored with Region XXIII and Southeastern District

Before taking over the head duties, Federico served as the assistant coach for two year, working with pitchers and catchers. As an assistant, he helped lead the Eagles to two conference championships, one region, and one sectional championship and a trip to the 2000 JUCO World Series.

Prior to joining the staff at Meridian, Federico served as a graduate assistant coach at Southern Miss for two years under Corky Palmer. In 1999, his last year with the Gold Eagles, he helped the black and gold to the NCAA Southeast Regional, in Tuscaloosa, AL.

As a player, Federico was a catcher at Southern Miss from 1995-97, serving as the team captain his senior year. He started his collegiate career at Hinds Community College (1993-95), where he was he starting catcher and helped his teams to back-to-back Division II World Series appear-

Federico received both his undergraduate degree to physical education (1998), and his master's degree in sports administration (1999) from Southern Miss.

A native of Slidell, LA, Federico attended Pope John Paul II High School, where he was the starting catcher for four years. During this time, he was named All-State, All-District, All-Metro and team captain.

Federico is married to the former Hanna Sosa of Bush, LA, who is also a Southern Miss graduate and former Golden Eagle Diamond Darline. The couple has two sons, Hayden and Brycen.
