LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

Erik Graham introduced the speaker, Cindy Pennington, with the Association of Retarded Citizens.

Cindy reported that the national Association for Retarded Citizens will be changing its name in the coming months, which will necessitate a name change for the local chapter. The new name will be the Association for the Rights of Citizens with Disabilities.

The ARC has a full-time program in the Hattiesburg area including a Summer Adventures Program where almost 100 children can participate in a summer camp program very similar to a camp that children without disabilities can attend. Other programs include a Structured Leisure program where participants can swim, go to movies, bowl and out to restaurants for meals. There is also an Adult and Children Respite program and another for medically fragile children. Other programs include a Buddy Program, Adult Socials and the very important Mothers Morning Out program offered to parents of children with disabilities every Thursday morning. Cindy says that program may offer the only chance that a mother may have to run errands or do other things that she needs or wants to do. The ARC has a

monthly newsletter and a website. Club members were encouraged to visit www.hattiesburgarc.org for more information and/or details.

Another important element of the ARC is the use of community volunteers. Cindy reports that forty area children volunteers come to the ARC facility and play with the participants. This is an excellent opportunity for the participants to interact with persons without disabilities as well as an opportunity for the volunteers to learn more about the participants and the challenges and opportunities they encounter daily. The center also serves as a practicum site for a number of students from The University of Southern Mississippi.

ARC fundraising events each year include the State Farm Golf Tournament and Golf Ball Drop. That event is coming up on May 19. Anyone interested in playing or sponsoring is encouraged to contact Erik Graham. Club members were also invited to purchase a ball in the ball drop. The cost is \$100 and substantial prizes are awarded to the ball which lands either in the hole or nearest the hole. Another annual fundraiser is the annual Kidnapping Program where a participant is kidnapped and the parents or friends are encouraged to raise "bail" money. Direct contributions to the organization total about \$30,000 annually. ARC is a United Way Agency and depends largely on that support to sustain operations.

Goals for the coming year, in addition to the name change, include getting a state license for the ARC Day Care program and the construction of a new multi-purpose facility. The fundraising goal for the new facility is \$400,000.
