MINUTES FROM 05/03/11

President Bill McLeod presided over today's meeting.

She encouraged members each to make a 4 box recipe of brownies for the Toast from the Coast event scheduled in Bay St. Louis on May 23rd. LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM SUMMARY

Wes Brooks then introduced today's guest speaker, Stan Gwen. Stan is with Megagate. Leonard Wyatt from the company was also in attendance and will remain after the program in the event members have specific technical questions or needs.

Stan reported that he was first involved with computers approximately 30 years ago while an 8th grade student.
