

MINUTES FROM 05/10/11

President Bill McLeod presided over today's meeting.

Dan Kibodeaux provided the invocation and Chris Price led the club in the Pledge of Allegiance. Bill then led members in the Four Way Test.

Special thanks to our greeters today who were Jared Eastlack and Allen Anderson.

Wes Brooks then introduced today's visiting Rotarians and guests. David McPhail is visiting from the Sunrise Club. Amanda Lee is a guest of David Owens and Amanda Winters is a guest of Gene Winters.

Bill asked that members continue to keep Paul McMullan and his family in their thoughts and prayers. He continues to remain in critical condition after a recent surgery.

Thanks to Chris Strebeck for providing today's Rotary Foundation raffle item. Congratulations to Erik Graham who won the gift certificate.

Mike Bonnette announced the recipients of two RYLA scholarships the club is providing this year and three-one-thousand Grover Anderson Scholarship recipients. RYLA winners are Shelby Gatewood and Grant Mitchell. Claire Ratliff, Austin Clinton and Yusef Buti are the Grover Anderson Scholarship recipients.

Erik Graham encouraged members to get more involved in the annual golf tournament project. The tournament raises a great deal of money that goes to assist local community programs, such as the ARC. He noted that other clubs seem to have better member participation in their club projects. He needs sponsorships, teams, volunteers and hole sponsors. Anyone interested should see Erik. The tournament is set for June 4th.

LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM SUMMARY

Janice Touchstone came forward and introduced today's speaker, Dr. Ben Burnett, Superintendent of the Lamar County School District.

Dr. Burnett, having spoken to the Club shortly after his election to this position in 2007 provided members with an update on the school system. He reported that the system now has more than 9,000 students which is up about 1,200 over the last three years. He also released a study of the projected attendance rates over the next ten years. It is anticipated that the Lamar County School System will serve between 12,500 and 17,500 students by 2020. Based on recent student enrollment numbers, Ben reports that the system is about in the middle of that projection currently.

Based on the anticipated growth in the county and the school population, Dr. Burnett's office is putting together a site selection plan to determine where the new campuses will be located in the coming years. Rather than having to face a major expenditure for new campus development in 2020, Dr. Burnett anticipates that they will be able to gradually incorporate a 40 to 50 million dollar capital campaign during this time frame.

The school system faced a \$4 million budget cut last year. Employees were reduced from 1,240 down to 1,271 without reducing the number of classroom teachers and without any

layoffs. School district employees had to take a cut in pay. In addition, the district has had to take another \$3 million in budget cuts throughout this school year.

Even during the hard economic times, Dr. Burnett reports that the dropout rate has declined from 14.5% down to 13%. The district has also seen a substantial increase in the number of students enrolled in the vocational education program. That population increased from 110 in 2008 to 230 this year.

Going forward, Dr. Burnett does not see a need to increase the school district's millage in the coming budget year. He is projecting an increase of 21 new teachers to be added to the classrooms in the coming school year.

He did ask club members to consider participating in the Educational Foundation. The Foundation raises money to supplement the money that teachers spend on their classrooms each year. Each teacher currently receives \$160 per year while it is anticipated that they each spend more than \$500 a year on supplies. Dr. Burnett also asked club members to consider participating in a mentoring program. You will spend 45 minutes a month having lunch and visiting with a first or second grade student that is in need of a mentor.

TODAY'S PROGRAM

Bio of Hal Kittrell

Hal Kittrell is the District Attorney of the 15th Circuit Court District, which comprises Jefferson Davis, Lamar, Lawrence, Marion, and Pearl River counties. He was appointed District Attorney by Governor Haley Barbour in January, 2007, and was subsequently elected to a four year term in November of that same year. He served as an Assistant District Attorney for the 15th District for seven years prior to assuming the position of District Attorney.

Mr. Kittrell received his Bachelor of Business Administration from the University of Mississippi in 1980. He received his Juris Doctorate from the University of Mississippi School of Law and was admitted to practice law in the State of Mississippi in 1984. He was engaged in the private practice of law for 16 years before joining the District Attorney's Office. During that time he served as the Informal Adjustment Officer for the Marion County Youth Court and also served as a part-time Marion County Public Defender.

Mr. Kittrell is a member of the Character and Fitness Committee for the Mississippi Board of Bar Admissions, a member and past president of the Marion County Bar Association. He is also a former Commissioner of the Mississippi Bar Association and former member of the Board of Directors for the Mississippi Prosecutors Association.

Mr. Kittrell is an active member of First United Methodist Church of Columbia. He serves as Chairman of Administrative Council. He has formerly served as Chairman of Finance and Staff-Parish Relations.

Mr. Kittrell is married with two step-daughters and five grandchildren.
