Mike Ratliff then introduced today's speaker and her guest. Laura Hunt is a new employee of the Extra Table and is accompanying today's speaker, Raven Tynes. Raven is the Executive Director of the Extra Table. She has served in that position for the past 18 months. Laura is the organization's second employee.

The Extra Table was formed in 2009 when Robert St. John received a call from the Edward's Street Fellowship's food pantry requesting assistance. The panty was completely out of food and needed food to meet the demand. St. John teamed up with Sysco, the nation's largest food distributor and established a

program known as the Extra Table and developed a food delivery system to help feed the hungry across Mississippi. His concept initially was that every restaurant set at least one "extra table" each week for the hungry and contribute that money to the Extra Table organization. The organization would then purchase high quality, nutritious food products at the lowest possible price from Sysco and then distribute that much needed food to soup kitchens and food panties across the state.

So who's hungry in Mississippi? Raven decided she would do the investigative work initially to see just exactly what kind of problems we are facing in our state. What she found was staggering. According to Feeding America there are 638,000 Mississippians who will go to bed tonight hungry. Just in Forrest County alone the number is 22,000. Many of these are our

children. In many families both parents are holding down multiple jobs and still can't make ends meet. Their children eat breakfast and lunch at school but all too often go to bed without eating. Many of our hungry at seniors who have a very limited, fixed income and have to decide whether to keep the heat on and pay the water bill or eat. The need is great.

The Extra Table is providing food to 17 soup kitchens and food panties across the state. The two agencies they work with in Hattiesburg are the Edward's Street Fellowship Center and Christian Services. The organization is providing approximately 27 tons of food across the state each year with three to four tons of it coming to the Hattiesburg area. The Extra Table provides food to an area when donations from that area can pay for a food bundle. Bundles come in \$250, \$500 and \$750 values. These bundles are feeding approximately 86,000 meals this year. Raven was very excited to receive the \$700 Rotary check today. Southern Oaks agreed to forgo charging Rotary for today's meeting and the Club agreed that members would bring their own lunch and a little something extra for Edward's Street. Raven noted that our contribution would feed 1,000 people in our area.

Many thanks went to Raven for today's program and also to the Rotarians helping in this fight. If you'd like to make a tax-free contribution to the Extra Table you can send your check to P.O.
