MINUTES: June 25, 2013

President Maura McLaughlin presided over the meeting. Thanks to Kristina Gould who gave the invocation and to Wes Brooks who led the members in the Pledge of Allegiance. Thanks also to Tracie Fowler and Brian Moore who served as our greeters today.

Maura led the Club in the 4-Way Test and then asked Chris Price to introduce today's visiting Rotarians and guests. Maura thanked board members for their service throughout her term as president. She reported that the board met for the last time this fiscal year last evening. She thanked Jennifer Payne for hosting last night's meeting. Maura reported that the club will be presenting the Children's Center for Communications and Development a total contribution in the amount of \$10,500. That presentation will be made next week.

Wes Brooks then reported that the May membership attendance rate was 56 percent. He encouraged members to remember to sign in when they attend meetings or make up meetings. Remarks by Robert Cummings Past President, 2011-2012

Three exceptional individuals were selected this year by the awards committee. I would like to thank Jennifer Payne, Lucy Parkman, Mary Cromartie, and Bill McLeod for serving on that committee with me this year; it was a pleasure working with you all. Jennifer distributed a club survey and based on those results and the input of the committee the awardees were selected. Thank you committee.

"Sonny 34" Cotton, I know, would be proud to have his name attached to the "New Rotarian of the Year" Award and he would equally be pleased to know this year's winner. This member moved to Hattiesburg in January of last year and soon after joined this club having been sponsored by Bill McLeod. He originally is from Biloxi and graduated Milsaps in 2011 earning a BA in Public Administration. He is the Branch Coordinator for the Red Cross and in that role responds to disasters for a living. He immediately impressed this club with his willingness to serve and his character. He is already a veteran of our out of town district conferences and is currently serving on the Bike a Thon Committee. He probably would have sold all of those Blue Dog District Raffle tickets if that dang tornado would not have hit his office this past Spring-that was a first. This member gave us a fantastic program one week when we didn't have a speaker with practically no notice; in addition his attendance and volunteerism is commendable. For his work in this club and in the community the winner of the Milam S. Cotton New Rotarian Award is Chase Munro.

The Bill Gwyn "Non Rotarian" Service Award is this club's best effort to look out onto the broader community to recognize greatness in our midst. This year's winner hails from Kentwood, LA and moved to Hattiesburg in 1990 to study at USM. While at USM he earned his BS in Psychology and a Masters of Social Work. He and his wife Heather have been married for 12 years and have two daughters Isabelle and Presley ages 5 and 10.

This individual has spent 20 years in the behavioral health field and is a Certified Advanced Alcohol and Drug Counselor. He and his wife, Heather, went into private practice almost 4 years ago when they opened their counseling center, Sycamore Tree Counseling Services, where they provide counseling for children, adolescents and adults. Additionally, he is involved with several other ventures including acting as Housing coordinator for Mississippi United to End Homelessness and teaching as an adjunct professor with the Social Work program at USM. Seven years ago he started visiting homeless camps in and around Hattiesburg and within a few years co-founded Hope House Ministries, a 501 (c)3 focusing on providing outreach to the homeless men and women living on our streets. In that role he has presented to this club twice in the past year.



Hope House is an outreach ministry to the homeless located at 1105 West Pine. Hope House Outreach operates on Saturday mornings and provides showers, washer and dryer access, clothing, mailing address, computer access, food bags, and camping supplies to the homeless. But most importantly it offers friendship and unconditional Christ-like love to men and women who often feel unlovable. Each Saturday a different
