


MINUTES: March 5

Maura McLaughlin presided over the meeting. Thanks to Scott Hummel, who gave the invocation and to Erik Graham who led the members in the Pledge of Allegiance. Thanks also to Wes Brooks and Sean Priebe who served as our greeters today.

McLaughlin led the Club in the 4-Way Test and then asked Brooks to introduce today's guests.

Brandon Hodges, Petal Club President, was a visiting Rotarian. Elizabeth Gillentine and Chris Booth were guests of Scott Hummel. Sara Peterson was the guest of Kristy Gould. Robert Cornett's daughter, Grace, was his guest.

McLaughlin announced that the Hattiesburg Rotary Club theme for 2013-2014 is "Engage Rotary Change Lives!" and mentioned that the "Friends Forever Program" would be April 19-20. Metairie Rotarian, Karen Babin, presides over this program. The mission of "Friends Forever" is to create trust, empathy and friendships among cultures in conflict by working with international and local youth leaders.

Hummel gave an update about his experience at P.E.T.S. (President-Elect Training Seminar). McLaughlin mentioned that she received emails complimenting Hummel and his attending this seminar.

McLaughlin came forward and introduced today's speaker Deborah Schiller.

Schiller works at Pine Grove's Gentle Path Program as the Clinical Director and Primary Therapist. She is a Licensed Professional Counselor (LPC) and Certified Sex Addiction Therapist-Supervisor (CSAT-S).

Schiller gave an informative presentation on sexual addiction. She began by stating that studies have proven brain scans change very little, if at all, even though those studied had different addictions, i.e. there is very little biological difference between that of a gambling addict or drug addict. A growing number of researchers believe the same processes lie behind all addictions whether it is gambling or shopping, drugs, love, work, exercise, pornography, eating or sex.

Schiller also reported that it is highly likely addiction will affect everyone's life in some form or fashion. She also stated that one does not have to be addicted to be affected. To clarify, Schiller stated that everyone in an addict's life suffers in some way.

Schiller concluded by reporting that there is hope and treatment for those suffering with chemical and/or behavioral addiction. She encouraged people to find out more by contacting Pine Grove.
