

#### MINUTES: October 1, 2013

President Scott Hummel presided over the meeting. Thanks to Kristy Gould who gave the invocation and to Chase Munro who led the members in the Pledge of Allegiance. Scott then led the Club in the 4-Way Test and then asked Wes Brooks to introduce today's guests. Julian Allen is a guest of Kristy Gould. Andy Davidson is a guest of Allen Anderson. Prospective member Ryan Kelly is a guest of Scott Hummel. Scot2t noted that Ryan will be inducted as a new member next week.

The Bike-a-Thon is quickly approaching. Additional sponsorship opportunities remain available for any company interested. Pos2ters are now available and Rotarians are asked to take and display them.

Aaron Ladner has organized a service day for club members on the morning of October 26. Sign-ups are encouraged. Club members will be assisting Home of Hope in a clean-up effort. If you can't make the clean-up day, members are encouraged to donate products that are needed at the center. A list of items is available from Aaron.

Allen Anderson then introduced today's guest speaker, Dr. William Lewis, President of Pearl River Community College. Dr. Lewis became the college's tenth president in July, 2000.

According to Dr. Lewis Pearl River Community College was started in 1909 as an Agricultural High School. The two-year college program in our state is the oldest such program in the country. There are 15 Community Colleges in Mississippi today with an enrollment of more than 80,000 full-time students. Additionally Community Colleges trained 95,000 in trade programs and provided educational assistance to another 20,000 through adult based programs last year. Community College enrollment represents 68% of all freshmen enrolled throughout the state.

The average age of a community college student is 25. Approximately 74% of all those enrolled are enrolled in full-time studies. Sixty-three percent of community college students are female and 97% of all enrollees are Mississippi residents.

State funding for community colleges is a problem according to Dr. Lewis. Community colleges were funded at 52% of the Mid-Level funding legislation



passed in 2007. That law requires the legislature to fund community colleges at a level mid-way between what is appropriated for K – 12 and Regional Universities. To bring the funding level up to what the law requires the Legislature would need to appropriate an additional \$2,402 per student next year, something Dr. Lewis says is very unlikely. However, the community colleges are asking the legislature to consider funding them at one-half of the shortfall.

Another serious problem facing the community college program is that of remedial education. The legislature is considering legislation that will eliminate all funding for remedial education programs in the state by 2018. Dr. Lewis maintains that eliminating funding for those programs will leave a large number of Mississippians on the street with no viable education and no skill training, something that he says will be very bad for our state's economy. Community colleges are spending about 28 million dollars a year on remedial education programs.
