

MINUTES FROM 11/09/2010

Club President, Bill McLeod, presided over the meeting.

Thanks to Freddy Walters, who gave the invocation and to Dan Kibodeaux, who led the Club in the Pledge of Allegiance. Bill then led members in the Four Way Test.

Wes Brooks welcomed today's guests and visitors. Milam (Sonny) Cotten brought four guests: Dr. Lynn McMahan, Dr. Jaime Jaminez, Dr. Jan Cruses, and Dr. Francis Sones. Rick Duke was a guest of Robert Cummings.

Special thanks to our greeters for today, who were Chris Price and Larry LeBlanc.

Bill read a special thank-you note from Annie Wimbish. Annie wanted to thank everyone for their support and prayers after the loss of her brother.

Bill asked members to notice the Election Ballots on the tables and to take a few moments and vote for only four (4) candidates for the next two fiscal years (2011/2012 and 2012/2013). The five highest votes will be elected, with the 5th candidate to serve only one fiscal year (2011/2012). Votes will be tallied today.

Scott Hummel said that he appreciates everyone's support of the Rotary Foundation and their participation in the weekly raffles, which have so far generated over \$700. Jennifer Payne was happy to report that only 20 tickets remain to be sold for the Wine Tasting Event that is set for next Friday, November 19th at 6:30pm at the Ogletree House of USM. She has a list of the Silent Auction items, which include things like handmade rugs, Christmas ornaments, a trip to the Smokey Mountains, and tickets to the New Orleans Saints football game. She will have a preview of the items at next Tuesday's luncheon. They have collected \$2,100 in sponsorships thus far. Jennifer said they have all the volunteers that are needed and said thank you for all of your support.

Jeri Buti gave his monthly report on Rotarian Magazine. The November issue has a really cute cover with a picture of a baby on it. The featured article is "Ending Polio". Every issue has a lot of very interesting and informative topics and he urges everyone to take time to read each issue. You will learn and understand a lot more about the world and its' struggles and the efforts of many organizations who help. One great

story was about the old motto, "Never give a man fish, but give him the bait, the pole, and the skills to learn how to fish".

Bill quickly announced that Suzy Steen and other members of the R.I. Convention Committee are meeting next Tuesday, November 16th at 11:15am here at Southern Oaks. If you are interested in learning more or want to join the committee, you may attend that meeting.

LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

Bill then introduced Dr. Ronald Schwartz, M.D. Dr. Schwartz is the director and principal investigator at the Neurological Research Center at Hattiesburg Clinic. He completed his neurology residency at Albert Einstein College of Medicine in Bronx, NY. He is board-certified in neurology and is a certified physician investigator with the APPI. He has been actively involved in clinical research since 1994.

This is Alzheimer's Awareness Month, and Dr, Schwartz wanted to speak specifically about Alzheimer's and Dementia today. The diagnoses have changed dramatically over the last 25 years. The guidelines were first published in 1984 and 2010 has seen a major update in diagnostic criteria. There are four levels of diagnosing a patient: Definite, Probable, Possible, and Improbable. When diagnosing the doctors will use evaluations and judgments. They will look at genetic history and interview members of the family for history. This condition has a gradual onset where patients experience a gradual progressive decline of cognitive and behavioral symptoms.

With new information, research, and technology, doctors are beginning to use tests like bio-markers, gene markers, MRI scans, PET scans (which both show protein and plaque buildups in the brain), and clinical trial information. In an article written in the NY Times, Sandra Day O'Connor states that effective 1/1/2011, our baby boomers will turn age 65 at the rate of one every eight seconds. That means four-million people per year face an increased risk of Alzheimer's. It is estimated that by the year 2050, 13 million people will have Alzheimer's. The government is ignoring this terrible threat. It is sad that for every penny that scientists spend on researching this disease, American's spend \$3.50 on caring for people with this condition. This means it is costing too much NOT to conduct more adequate research. Developing ways to cut the risk of onset of this disease and to identify and heal brain damage or plaque build-ups in the brain, will reduce or at least postpone the number of people that will fight this disease. The National Institutes of Health still spends six times more money on AIDS research than on Alzheimer's research! Congress needs to pass legislation that would raise the annual federal investment to \$2 billion.

Bill gave Dr. Schwartz a small token of our appreciation. He then announced the winners of today's elections. New Board of Directors serving a two-year term include: Wes Brooks, James Duncan, Jennifer Payne, and Janice Touchstone. Lucy Parkman will also serve on the Board in a one-year term. Congratulations to all of them! Bill then adjourned the meeting with our motto: Service above Self.
