MINUTES FROM 10/26/2010

Club President, Bill McLeod, presided over the meeting.

Thanks to Dan Kibodeaux, who gave the invocation and Audra Cummings, who led the Club in the Pledge of Allegiance. Bill then led members in the Four Way Test.

Wes Brooks welcomed today's guests and visitors. Welcome to Pierce Stevens from the Petal Rotary Club. Joe Spell had his daughter Sharon Spell as his guest. Joe Davis was a guest of Shawn Jones. Mike Bonnette was a guest of Wes Brooks. Mike is considering membership in the Hattiesburg Rotary. Jamie Lynn Garnett a new USM faculty members was a guest of Lance Nail.

Special thanks to our greeters for today, who were Jaclyn Adams and Andrea Hood.

Bill then introduced Thor Sovingjan from Iceland. She was presented a Club flag and presented our club with a flag from her Iceland Club.

Erik Graham then came forward and introduced Tina Hoda with the Association for the Rights of Citizens with Developmental Disabilities. Erik presented the ARC with a check in the amount of \$7,250 from the Club. He thanked all of the members, volunteers and sponsors who participated in this year's golf tournament. Their efforts made this contribution possible.

Janice Touchstone then presented the Rotary Foundation raffle winners of the week. Allen Anderson and Larry LeBlanc were the winners of USM football tickets provided by Mary Cromartie and Tracy Fowler. Thanks to Mary and Tracy for making this week's raffle possible. Members are encouraged to provide products or services that can be used in the weekly raffle. The proceeds from the raffle go to the Rotary International Foundation.

Janice also asked members to complete and return the member survey that has been recently distributed.

Jennifer Payne reminded members of the wine tasting event scheduled for November 19th. Tickets are on sale. There are also opportunities for members to provide items for the silent auction. Participants may also purchase raffle tickets for a ring that is provided by Light's Jewelers. See Jennifer or Jaclyn Adams if you want tickets or would like to participate in other ways. Proceeds from the event will be used to fund community charitable events. Last year proceeds helped the Club provide seven Shelter Boxes to Haiti after the earthquake.

Mike Ratliff reported on a successful GSE Team visit. He thanked those who helped make the Team's visit a success.

Maura McLaughlin asked members to sign up for the Salvation Army bell ringing campaign. If you're interested please see Maura.

Bill called to attention the proposed slate of candidates for the 2011/2012 board of directors. The slate is published in today's SPOKES. He asked if there were any nominations from the floor. There were none. He reported that voting will take place in early November.

Dan Kibodeaux encouraged members to sign up to participate in the Reading Between the Lions project. He noted that holiday reading times are difficult to fill and encouraged anyone who can to assist.

LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

Dan then introduced today's guest speaker Janice Swiggum. Janice is the director of Friends for Financial Freedom, a United Way initiative. She introduced Linda Donnell who is the site coordinator for the local Christian Women's Job Corps.

Janice noted that, although both organizations operate independently, they share common goals and work together to accomplish those goals. Participants in the Christian Women's Job Corps must complete a ten week training course that aids them in re-gaining or gaining self-esteem and helping them gain more independence. Friends for Financial Freedom assists these and other participants in obtaining the necessary money management skills to exist. Both organizations have the goal of offering a "hand-up" to those they serve rather than a "hand-out" helping them to gain independence and to become productive citizens.

Both organizations are committed to the alleviation of poverty by offering education, training, motivation and support. The goal is to interrupt the cycle of dependency. Janice gave one example of a client who successfully completed the Christian Women's Job Corps program. She came into the program at the age of 23 and expecting her fourth child. After completing that course she took advantage of the money management program offered by Friends for Financial Freedom. She is now employed full-time and has recently obtained a part-time job and is taking care of her children. Three of her children are enrolled in school and one was recently on the academic honor roll. She is now working out a plan to work, take care of her family and pursue getting her GED. Her cycle of poverty has been interrupted through the assistance of these two "hands-up" programs.

Recently Friends for Financial Freedom obtained a Federal grant that allows them to match a savings program in an effort to help the candidates build assets. The grant allows the match of one dollar with four dollars for approved projects such as a down payment on a home or furthering your education.

Many thanks to Janice and Linda for being here today to describe these two community based programs. Volunteers are needed to mentor participants, teach the financial management courses or to assist in other ways where your talents can be best used. Stanley Carpenter gave today's Classification Talk. At age 11 Stanley grew up taking care of a dairy farm after his father died. His mom sold the farm and moved to the Hattiesburg area. He graduated from Hattiesburg High and then from The University of Southern Mississippi. He obtained his MBA from the University of Georgia. He taught accounting in New Orleans, at USM and at the University of Georgia. He ended his teaching career back at USM. From there he bought the old Pick-Wick Café in downtown Hattiesburg. He then opened a CPA firm in that building and continues to operate Carpenter and Carpenter with his daughter.
