

Allen Smithers was then introduced and gave us his classification talk. Allen was born in Clarksdale. MS. His dad was a school principal. Allen attended Delta State University and received his Masters from the University of Mississippi. His first real job was with Mississippi College. After MC he was the Director of Instruction for the Mississippi Association of Independent Schools. He was then recruited to Grenada where he spent 16 years in the school system there. Five years ago he accepted the Headmaster's position at PCS. He has been married for more than 30 years and he and his wife have three children and three grandchildren. He has dedicated much of his professional volunteer time with the Association of Private Schools.

The Nominating Committee reported that it has completed the slate of candidates for the coming year. Elections will be held at the November 29th meeting.

#### PROGRAM SUMMARY

Allen Smithers then introduced today's program speaker, Dr. Lance Nail, Dean of the University of Southern Mississippi Business College and a Rotarian.

Dr. Nail gave us an update on the progress for the new building that will house the College of Business. He announced that Chuck Scianna has contributed five million dollars to the project which has accelerated the time line for construction. Because of the size of the Scianna contribution, the building will be known as the Scianna College of Business. The new facility will face Highway 49 and will be approximately two and one half the size of the Trent Lott Center. When completed, the building will provide about 93,000 gross square feet with be about sixty thousand square feet.

Construction costs for the new building are estimated to be \$36 million. Another \$3 million will be endowed for maintenance.

The new facility will provide about 1.000 seats for business school students and 90 offices for business school staff and faculty. Another 1,000 seats and 75 offices will also be made available for other colleges and units across the campus.

The new facility will be student friendly. It will provide study areas, an area for tutoring, technologically advanced equipment and capabilities that will link USM students to the world's business environment. According to Dr. Nail, a USM student will be able to video conference with other students and professionals around the world.

The project requires \$10 million to be raised from the private sector. As of the end of October \$7.8 million has been raised or pledged. State bonding will provide the remaining \$26 million for construction. The \$3 million maintenance endowment can be raised after the construction process begins. Dr. Nail is optimistic that ground can be broken for the new building in the Spring and hopefully the building can be occupied in the Fall of 2014.
