

MINUTES FROM 11/22/11

President-Elect Maura McLaughlin presided over the meeting.

Thanks to Scott Hummel, who gave the invocation, and to Gene Winters, who led the Club in the Pledge of Allegiance. Maura then led members in the Four Way Test. Thanks to today's greeter, Dan Kibodeaux.

Sean Priebe introduced today's visitors. Janice Touchstone has her husband Brad as a guest. Bill McLeod has Brad Stinson as his guest. Bill also recognized former member Francis Farmer who is visiting today.

Maura reminded board members that the November board meeting will be held on Monday, November 28th. Refreshments will be served beginning at 5:15 and the board meeting will begin at 5:30 p.m. The meeting will be held at the United Way of Southeast Mississippi.

Dan Kibodeaux encouraged members to sign up for the November and December reading schedule in the Reading Between the Lions program.

The Nominating Committee reported that it has completed the slate of candidates for the coming year. Elections will be held at the November 29th meeting.

Maura reminded members of the Christmas event which will be held at Southern Oaks at noon on December 13th. Funds raised during this event will be used to help provide Christmas for needy children in the Forrest county area.

Anyone interested in participating in the annual Salvation Army bell-ringing project on December 10th and 17th is encouraged to see Richard Topp.

Maura announced that Stan Causey will be inducted as a new member at the November 29th meeting.

PROGRAM SUMMARY

Todd Bradley then introduced today's program speaker, Circuit Court Judge Bob Helfirch.

Judge Helfrich noted that he has been in the criminal justice system for more than twenty-five years and that he continues to see the same people coming through the system, repeatedly. He is of the opinion that the system is broken and in need of

repair. According to Helfrich, most of the people serving prison time will return to society at some point in their lives. In Mississippi when a prisoner is released he or she is given a \$15 check and a bus ticket that will get them back to the county of their conviction. Judge Helfrich says once the released convict gets back into society they have a great chance of getting back into trouble and returning to the criminal justice system.

In an effort to repair one part of the system a specialized Drug Court system was introduced in Miami, FL in 1989. A few years later Helfrich began a drug court in his district. First-time drug and alcohol offenders are given the option of going through the Drug Court system or serving prison time. The Drug Court is a four-phase program consisting of nine months in each phase. Phase one is treatment of the addiction. Phase two is stabilization when the subject gets a GED and a job. The final two phases of the program consist of intense monitoring. At any time during the program a subject is found to be using alcohol or drugs they immediately go to jail and serve their sentence. Just over 70% of prisoners return to prison. Only 16% of those who graduate from the Drug Court system return to the system.

In 2008 in Buffalo, NY a Veterans Treatment Court was begun. Today there are 90 throughout the country, including a new one in Helfrich's district. About 1% of our population consists of veterans and according to the Judge, they have special issues and needs. The Veterans Treatment Court will take the vets out of the Drug Court system and treat them differently. There are currently 144,000 veterans in prison or jail. Approximately 50% of those are in jail due to drug and/or alcohol problems. About 25% of all the homeless in America are veterans. Domestic violence cases are very high among this population. Helfrich believes that by treating the underlying problems these individuals are attempting to deal with, they can be rehabilitated and returned to society as a productive citizen.

Janet McKenzie Baldwin is the single mother of four ch dren: Andrea, Jasmine, Donnie, and T.J. She also has grand-children. She was born and raised in Clarke Cour - Quitman, Mississippi and is one of 18 siblings.

She has been a resident of Petal, MS for the past years. She retired in 2007 after working for 23 years w Georgia Pacific Pulp and Paper Mill in New Augusta, where she worked in several departments and job area She is a 1979 graduate of Jones County Jr. College w an Associates Degree in Sales and Marketing. She a received many other community recognitions such 2005 Citizen of the year award by Phi Rho Chapter Omega Psi Phi, 2006 Making a Difference Day Award Ward 2 from City of Hattiesburg, 2010 Extraordina Service in Black Family Involvement Award by The Sigma Omega Chapter and a 2010 Dedication award the Pine Belt Minority Worker Training Program fro Dillard University and the Deep South Center Environmental Justice. In 2010 she also received Honorary Doctor of Humane Letters award from Aga Bible College in conjunction with the Ambassador for Christ Church.
