Wes reminded everyone to bring a bag lunch to next week's meeting and the check usually given to Southern Oaks is going to be donated to the Extra Table charity.

Randy Price explained how the Fieldhouse for the Homeless started and its objectives. It is a ministry that was started by two sisters; Cynthia Young and Priscilla Brown to help with the homeless in our community. The objective is to help the homeless get into housing, help to furnish everyday household items, help them get back in touch with family members and reenter society. Ryan Kelly then introduced today's guest speaker, Mike Lopinto. Mike has been with Festival South when they were only able to put on one or two concerts a year during the summer months. It is a part of the Hattiesburg Concert Association.

There are four main goals of Festival South; Education, Enrichment, Business and Tourism.

Education: Bring events to our community students, from collegiate level to preschool. We want to get the music to them. We had Peter and the Wolf playing this morning at the Saenger Theater. There were around 300 children that were bused in from all over the state.

Enrichment: To bring in and promote high quality art events, e.g. sculptures, singers, dancers, instrumentalists etc. into the community. We are creating a rich culture of the arts in our area.

Business: To help increase the economy here for local businesses. We want the people that are staying in hotels and visiting with friends and family to shop in our stores, eat in our restaurants and have something to do while they are in town. To see that there are so many thing going on in our town that they will want to come back.

Tourism: Bring in new tourists to see what we now have to offer and see what is going on in our town. We are constantly growing and expanding things to do and see around the Hattiesburg area.

We did a study and it showed there has been a boom that festival south brought over the last few years, bringing in about 8 million dollars within the 2 week period of the festival.

We are having a festival South Film Expo on June 2 – 4th, 2015. We are soliciting films, film makers and production crews to bring into town.

On June 5th, there will be an award show called "The Best of the Awards Red Carpet Event". Awards will be given for the film expo on this night and after the award show, there will be a party for all the people who have won awards, the film makers and for anyone that purchased a ticket.

Some other festivals that we are in the process of creating are: Festival 5 K, Festival South Diners Club- with the local restaurants and Festival Fashion Week and Festival Furry- with pets and a pet parade and festival Shares.

Festival Shares: To find ways to completely sponsor not just our headline events but all our events. The goal is to do an event with all the expenses taken care of by sponsors then take the proceeds and hand them over to the Extra Table. Make it a community wide celebration. Turn it into a focused effort of turning Festival South into a real festival. Anything anyone can do to help someone in our community. Buy the dinner for the car behind you in the drive through, cook someone dinner, help someone with their yard, anything to do to help someone.

The motion, if accepted would change the section to read "If a member is unable or unwilling to pay dues for 90 days, he or she shall be removed as a member barring extraordinary circumstances." The motion was accepted.

Michael Dixon is a native Floridian and graduate of Palm Beach Atlantic University in 1997 with a degree in Psychology. He completed his Masters of Divinity degree at the McAfee School of Theology, Mercer University in 2003. Later that year, he married wife Sarah Dixon (who is unequivocally out of his league) and soon after moved to Hattiesburg to begin a Young Adult ministry at First Baptist Church. In 2007, Michael founded Ekklesia Hattiesburg, a non-denominational community committed to serving those in need in Hattiesburg.

In January of 2014, Michael and Sarah welcomed history's most adorable child to date, Lillian Violet Dixon, into the world. In May of 2014, Michael assumed the new role of Executive Director of Extra Table, a Non-Profit agency based in Hattiesburg, which addresses both food insecurity and obesity in Mississippi by delivering healthy food in bulk to soup kitchens and food pantries. Extra Table is currently partnered with 17 food agencies throughout the state of Mississippi, spanning from Pascagoula to Jackson.
