Jeri Buti spoke about Rotarian Magazine. He said that all members receive monthly issues as part of their annual dues. The magazine contains great humanitarian articles, such as Polio and Haiti. He urges you to read the magazine when it comes to your home or office, as it keeps us connected with our district and with the entire world. Also, if you would ever like to write your own article related to Rotary for the magazine, you should submit it and ask the editors to publish it.

#### LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

Todd Bradley introduced today's guest speaker, Dr. Michael Garrett, Executive Director of the Homes of Hope for Children in Purvis, MS. Dr. Garrett also brought along his assistant, Sarah Dixon, who is Director of Communications at Homes of Hope. Club member Aime Spears had recently pushed our club to vote for Homes of Hope in the \$25k and the \$250k grants made available in the Pepsi Voting Challenge. Michael gave special thanks to Allen Anderson, Patrick Ward, Aime Spears, and Greg Buie for all of their support and efforts over the last year. Michael said that he and his wife and crew are so very thankful for everyone's support, votes, donations, and faith and prayers. He said they have been so blessed and he feels that they are carrying out God's plan in a way that will be beneficial to so many children and families.

Michael said their organization is a debt-free ministry.. They will not take out any loans and they rely strictly on fundraising and charitable contributions. Initially they had raised enough money to begin Phase I of the project, but realized it was going to take about another \$250k to add more space for more children. Two grants were awarded by Pepsi and they have been able to put 100% of that money into capital additions. They do not apply any of the money to operational expenses, because they cannot count on winning grants all the time, so they should function daily with only donations and fundraising. They welcomed their first two children at the Home on July 12th, and they now have five children. Within several years, they plan to be able to hold 42 children altogether.

Homes of Hope for Children offers a loving, Christian home for children who are in bad family circumstance and are in need of the best opportunity life has to offer. They may live there through their high school years, relying on consistency, love, support, a connection to Jesus and a stable environment. If they have siblings, they are ALL brought into the homes together so that they are not split apart. Michael said there are over 3500 children in the foster care system in the state of MS alone. Most of those children will live in at least 3 different homes every 14 months. More organizations like Homes of Hope are needed throughout the county so that every child will have the best opportunity in life.

When asked what the three top things that this ministry could use to thrive, Michael stated: prayer, monthly monetary donations, and food. He thanked everyone once again for their support and prayers. Bill then thanked Michael for his dedication and service to the children of the community. He then adjourned the meeting with our motto *Service above Self*.
