

Breast Self-Awareness (BSA)

1. Know your risk

- ☐ Talk to your family to learn about your family health history
- ☐ Talk to your doctor about your personal risk of breast cancer

2. Get screened

- Ask your doctor which screening tests are right for you if you are at a higher risk
- ☐ Have a mammogram every year starting at age 40 if you are at average risk
- ☐ Have a clinical breast exam at least every 3 years starting at 20, and every year starting at 40

3. Know what is normal for you

- ☐ See your health care provider right away if you notice any of these breast changes:
- · Lump, hard knot or thickening
- · Swelling, warmth, redness or darkening
- · Change in the size or shape of the breast
- · Dimpling or puckering of the skin
- · Itchy, scaly sore or rash on the nipple
- · Pulling in of your nipple or other parts
- Nipple discharge that starts suddenly
- · New pain in one spot that does not go away

4. Make healthy lifestyle choices

- ☐ Maintain a healthy weight
- ☐ Add exercise into your routine
- ☐ Limit alcohol intake

LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

Mary introduced today's special guest District Governor Greg Lier.

Greg reminded Club members that 25,000 children die each day throughout the world from preventable causes. Five-thousand of those die from a lack of sanitary water and/or sanitary conditions. He encouraged Club members to partner with other clubs through the nation and the world to help prevent these problems.

He singled out our Club's Book-Bear-Bag literacy program. He also mentioned a McComb Club's project of collecting books for their prisoners.

Greg encouraged Club members to participate in a giving campaign to the Rotary Foundation. He especially encouraged members to participate in the Bill Gates Foundation's matching grant program designed to eliminate polio. RI has raised 20 of the 100 million dollars in match during the first six months of the campaign. He encouraged our members to pledge \$33 per year for the next three years of this campaign.

He encouraged membership recruitment noting that the District has a net-gain goal this year of 200. The net gain last year totaled 140. Mary Cromartie and Erik Graham were recognized by Lier for their recent membership recruitment efforts.

The District Conference is scheduled for May 7 - 9, 2009 in Bay St. Louis.

Breast Cancer in Men:

Breast cancer occurs primarily in women, but men can also develop breast cancer. Although men have less breast tissue than women, they do have breast cells that can undergo cancerous changes. Male breast cancer makes up less than 1 percent of all cases of breast cancer, and is usually detected in men between 60 and 70 years of age.

Symptoms in Men:

It is important to see a doctor if any of the following changes to the breasts is noticed:

A lump or swelling in the chest area

Dimpled or puckered skin

A nipple that is inverted (facing inward)

Redness or scaling of the nipple or breast skin

Discharge from the nipple Most breast lumps in men are due to gynecomastia and not cancer. Gynecomastia, the most common male breast disorder, is an increase in the amount of a man's breast tissue. However, it is still important to see a medical professional about any of the symptoms, including a lump, to rule out male breast cancer.
