More than 2.2 million dollars were spent in that 3 week period.

This year Festival South starts on Memorial Day- May 30th and runs thru June 18, 2016. New for the 2016 season, is FestivalSpeaks. Hosted by media personality, Randy Swan, this will be a series of informative and innovative talks with special guests from politics, arts and more!

Returning favorites to the festival are the Festival5K, Best of the Pine Belt Awards Show, Coffee Concerts, Craft Beer Festival, Classical Afternoons, Artie Events for Kids, and FestivalLate Night.

The Festival South Film Expo for promoting local films and filmmakers with ties to the state of Mississippi and/or the American Deep South. There are competition sections for feature films and short films and our special **FestivalSouth EDGE** section, where at midnight each evening you can see a screening of weird, wacky, terrifying, extra- terrestrial, supernatural or otherwise out-of-the-box features. Some of the films can be voted on by the audience.

"Best of the Pine Belt" – On June 3rd, all of the winners will be announced. We started out a few years ago with roughly10, 000 votes for the nominees to now having over 136,000 votes. Another company had to be hired to take care of the voting because it's too large for the Festival South office. Keep the June issue of Signature Magazine with you and use it as guide for the best restaurant, thrift store, etc. when you are out and about. It's a wonderful way to try out new places that you haven't been to yet, and has been voted the "Best."

On April 2, Downtown Hattiesburg will be the host for Over the Edge, a once-in-alifetime event —sponsored by Southern Beverage and iHeartRadio— that gives participants the opportunity to rappel down a local high-rise building as a fundraiser for local non-profit Extra Table.

Throughout the coming months, participants will use peer-to-peer fundraising methods to raise money from their family, friends and community to help send them 'Over the Edge'. Once they have reached their fundraising goal, where they will rappel down the side of the recently restored Carter Building in Downtown Hattiesburg in an allday event. "Hub City Lofts is excited about hosting the Over the Edge event for the benefit of Extra Table at the Carter Building in downtown Hattiesburg," said Rob Tatum, Owner of Hub City Lofts. "My lawyer and insurance agent thought I was crazy when I approached them with this idea, but...we are all excited for what this event will do, raise money for a great cause, great exposure for Downtown, and ultimately the city of Hattiesburg. Having the Over the Edge coincide with Hubfest will only add interest to an already fantastic event," Tatum concluded.



The Over the Edge event will serve as a fundraiser for non-profit organization Extra Table. Founded by chef, author and restaurateur Robert St. John, Extra Table operates with the mission of providing new, healthy food for the 670,000 people who are food insecure in the state of Mississippi. Through a partnership with Sysco, the nation's largest food distributor, Extra Table raises funds, purchases healthy food bundles from Sysco and has the food shipped to over 20 food pantries and soup kitchens from Pascagoula to Tupelo with hopes to be in all 82 of Mississippi's counties. "We are in the midst of an exciting time in the history of Extra Table," said Michael Dixon, Executive Director of Extra Table. "We are experiencing unprecedented growth in our food distribution across the state. Participating in the Over the Edge event will not only be the most exciting thing you do this year, it will also make an enormous impact in our ability to feed the hungry. We hope everyone will join in the fun."

Over the Edge will also be a unique event for Hattiesburg this year because it will take place during HubFest, an annual festival developed by Hattiesburg Area Chamber of Commerce. HubFest occurs in downtown Hattiesburg, covering several blocks with over 250 artist and vendor booths and attracting tens of thousands of participants.
