Jennifer Payne then came forward and introduced today's guest speaker, LaShaunda René. LaShaunda works for the Mississippi Girl Scouts of America organization.

Girl Scouts is not just about cookie sales according to LaShaunda. Girl Scouts is about girl leadership, which Girl Scouts of America believes is critically important to our communities.

The girls engaged in Girl Scouts are challenged to learn about their communities and then share that knowledge with others. Finally they are asked to take actions using their knowledge to make improvements in their communities. When you see a Girl Scout selling cookies in the next few weeks, LaShaunda encourages us to ask them about their community project.



Cookie sales generate \$700 million dollars of revenue throughout the nation with just over \$4 million of that coming from Mississippi. For each box of cookies sold, the local organization gets to keep \$.65 for use in their community project.

Cookie sales has a five-step leadership development training attached to it that helps girls learn skills they can apply to everyday life.

They learn about money management, business ethics, setting goals, making decisions and developing people skills. Girl Scouts believe the program helps them build a lifetime of skills and confidence.


