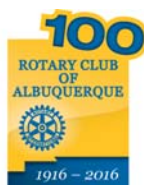

\$35,000 East Central Ministries Project (ECM)

Our club's biggest local project in many years has recently been completed. R.I. approved the project on August 13th, 2010, and funds became available soon after. The funding came from RI, Rotary Districts 5520 (NM & SW Texas) and 4110 (North Central Mexico), 4 Mexican Rotary Clubs – Juarez Campestre, Chihuahua Majalca, Ciudad Juarez, and Torreon Empresarial, and our club. Our club's total contribution of \$5,500 came from our Foundation and individual Rotarians.

Administration of the project went very smoothly. A student film maker, and friend of **Janet Thompson**, made a 17 ½ minute promotional [video](#) of the project, emphasizing

the cooperation between the US and Mexican Rotary Clubs and ECM. **Janet** has assisted ECM with economic/marketing advice and has helped with sales of honey produced by the Urban Farm section of ECM.
