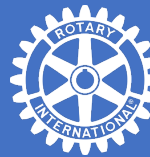

Naval Weapons Station Update



We meet at Grand Tradition this week. We will hear an update on the **Naval Weapons Station** from **Capt. Kyle Caldwell**, the station CO. Capt. Caldwell's past roles have included Weapons Officer on the *USS Abraham Lincoln* and Commanding Officer of the Center for Naval Aviation Technical Training Unit North Island. The Naval Ammunition Depot (NAD) Fallbrook was commissioned in February 1942. In 1958, NAD Fallbrook was designated an annex of Naval Ammunition and Net Depot, Seal Beach. In 1997, Detachment Fallbrook was designated as reporting to the present Naval Weapons Station Seal Beach.

North County Fire Protection District

We are back at Grand Tradition next week. Our guest speaker will be our own **Tom Harrington**. Tom is **Administrative Battalion Chief** at **North County Fire Protection District**. North County Fire has five fire stations staffed with fulltime, paid personnel and Single Role Paramedics and EMTs. The District's primary service area is almost 90 square miles with an estimated population approaching 55,000 people, as well as providing emergency medical services for 40 additional square miles outside the primary service area.

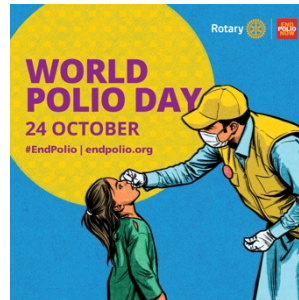

World Polio Day – Oct. 24



Rotary has a long and successful role in the efforts to eradicate polio. **Saturday, October 24**, is this year's **World Polio Day**. World Polio Day is a time for Rotary members, public health advocates, and all who want a world free from polio to come together, recognize our progress in the fight to end polio, and talk about the actions we need to take in order to end polio for good. In 1988, an estimated 350,000 children were paralyzed by wild polio across more than 125 countries. Today, thanks to the work of Rotary and our partners, we have reduced cases by 99.9%. Wild polio remains endemic in Pakistan and Afghanistan, and variant polio outbreaks threaten the progress we have made against the disease. We must keep other countries polio-free so it won't resurface.



Thanks to **Diana Wiggins**, our Community Service Director, our club will hold a **Dutch Lunch Fundraiser to End Polio** on **Thursday, October 29**, at

Mountain Mike's Pizza. Mountain Mike's will be donating 35% of proceeds to our fundraiser. This will be a Dutch Lunch, so we each pay our own way.
