





### Q3 How much has your Rotary knowledge improved because of the training at PETS 2013?



### Q4 Did you attend Rotary 101 on the afternoon of Friday, March 1st?



## Q5 How useful to your Rotary position was the information presented during Rotary 101.



### Q6 How would you rate Julie Phares as a presenter for Rotary 101?





# Q15 How useful to your Rotary position was the information discussed during this breakout session?





# Q18 How useful to your Rotary position was the information discussed during this breakout session?





### **Q20** Did you attend one or both of the Sunday Panel Discussions?
















