THE ROLE OF THE DISCUSSION LEADER

I. INITIATING

They get the discussion started or restarted to avoid group silence. One way group discussion leaders can do this is by posing a few specific questions about a presentation, particular reading segment, point or topic.

2. FACILITATING PARTICIPATION

It is very important to make sure that all members get an opportunity to participate or speak. If anyone or a few dominate a group, it is the responsibility of the discussion leader to rectify this situation. This may mean going around the group, in-turn, or calling on people.

3. EXPEDITING AND SUMMARIZING

Keeping the discussion on topic and moving. It also includes summarizing what the group has said and then moving on. In addition, the discussion leader should be prepared to clarify information and synthesize it, and on occasion, draw connections between different comments or points.
