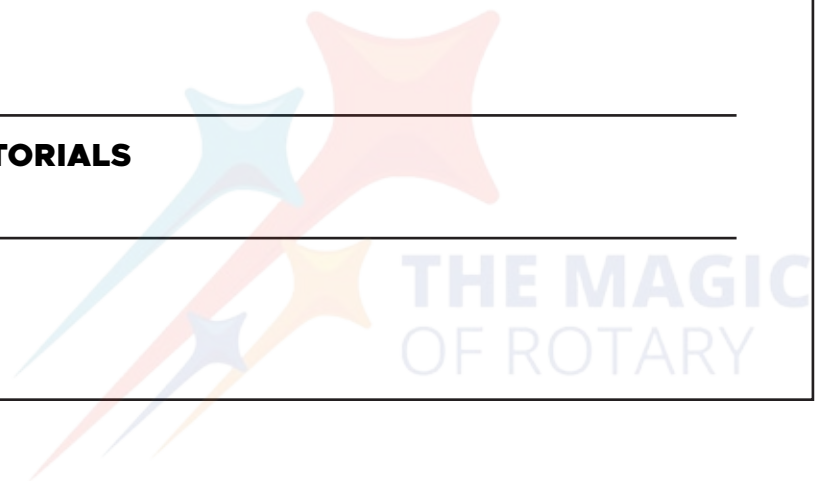

# WITH HEART AND MIND

To adapt, as laid out in Rotary's Action Plan, we must occasionally step out of our comfort zone and try something new. Here are two examples of clubs that adapted — one with heart and one through critical thinking and strategy.

The Rotary Club of Chandigarh Mid Town, India, led with heart earlier this year. To engage members and grow membership, Club President Nitin Kapur personally called every former member of the club and invited them to a gathering billed as an alumni meetup.

Eight former members attended, and the results were stupendous. The visitors had a chance to connect once more not only with current members but with the sense of camaraderie and belonging that membership gave them. By the end of the evening, the club welcomed six of the former members back into the Rotary family.

Club President Kapur showed courage when he reached out to the alumni. Not only did he adapt and try something new but he had the strength of character to show the club's alumni how much they still meant to the family of Rotary. That bravery paid off.

People want to feel needed and appreciated. People want to feel that they belong. And they might never feel that way if we don't have the courage to tell them.

Meanwhile, the Rotary Club of Seoul-Hansoo, Korea, has been experimenting with different club models to great effect. Over the past four years, Seoul-Hansoo has created and maintained four satellite clubs — a service club, an interest-based club for musicians, a cause-based club that mentors professionals, and a club for college students.

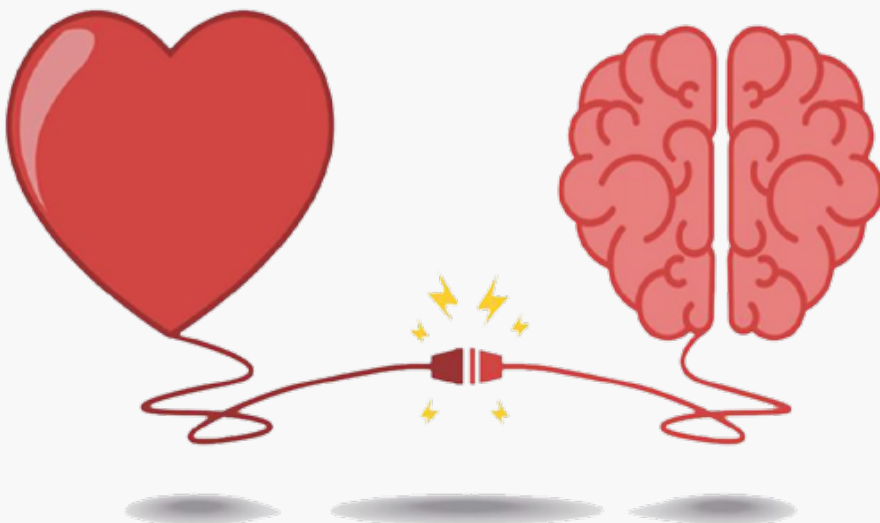
These satellite clubs are part of a five-year plan the Seoul-Hansoo club implemented to increase membership through innovation.

What's the secret to founding and maintaining so many satellite clubs? Membership between Seoul-Hansoo and its satellite clubs is fluid and synergistic. Many members of the satellite clubs attend the sponsor club's meetings.

And many of the sponsor club's members participate in the satellite clubs.

Additionally, the focus of each satellite club is no accident. Each one appeals to different interests of people in the sponsor club and in the community, attracting existing and potential members. This is an excellent strategy to both retain and attract members because it offers flexibility. If someone is interested in joining but they can't make it to the sponsor club's meetings, they have plenty of options to choose from.

These are just two examples of how we can adapt with our hearts and minds. Every club is different, so I encourage you to reach out to members of your club and of the community around you. Ask them about the club experience and what you can do to improve. Talk to enough people and you might find ways that you can adapt and spark The Magic of Rotary in your club.

# VALUE OF GIVING

Katharine Hepburn, in her own words:

"Once, when I was a teenager, my father and I were standing in line to buy tickets for the circus. Finally, there was only one family between us and the ticket counter. That family made a lasting impression on me.

There were eight children, all under the age of 12. From the way they were dressed, you could tell they didn't have much money, but their clothes were clean, very clean. The children were well-behaved, standing in pairs behind their parents, holding hands.

They were so excited about the clowns, the animals, and all the acts they would see that night. From their excitement, you could tell they had never been to a circus before. It was going to be a highlight of their lives.

The father and mother stood proudly at the front of their little group. The mother was holding her husband's hand, looking at him as if to say, 'You're my knight in shining armor.' He was smiling, enjoying seeing his family happy.

The ticket lady asked how many tickets he wanted, and he proudly responded, 'I want eight children's tickets and two adult tickets.' Then she announced the price.

The wife let go of her husband's hand, her head dropped, and the man's lip began to quiver. He leaned in closer and asked, 'How much did you say?'

The ticket lady repeated the price. He didn't have enough money. How was he supposed to turn around and tell his eight kids that he couldn't afford to take them to the circus?

Seeing what was happening, my dad reached into his pocket, pulled out a \$20 bill, and dropped it on the ground. We weren't rich by any means. My father bent down, picked up the \$20 bill, tapped the man on the shoulder, and said, 'Excuse me, sir, this fell out of your pocket.'

The man understood what was happening. He wasn't being handed charity, but he gratefully accepted the help in his desperate, heartbreaking, and embarrassing situation. He looked straight into my father's eyes, took my dad's hand in both of his, squeezed the bill tightly, and with trembling lips and a tear streaming down his cheek, he replied, 'Thank you, sir. This really means so much to me and my family.'

My father and I went back to our car and drove home. The \$20 my dad gave away was what we had planned to use for our own tickets. Although we didn't see the circus that night, we felt a joy inside us that was far greater than seeing the circus.

That day, I learned the true value of giving. The Giver is greater than the Receiver.

If you want to be great, greater than life itself, learn to give. Love has nothing to do with what you expect to get, only with what you expect to give—everything.

The importance of giving and blessing others cannot be overstated because there is always joy in giving. Learn to make someone happy through acts of giving."

As time went on, I felt I needed to achieve more, to look further, and to break the cage I was in and that's when I took a step to seek mentorship. I don't regret the step I took. Each one of us can give a helping hand to another in one way or the other but the way we do it matters. Most people think mentorship is for those who are struggling yet mentorship is good for us to reach our full potential. You may not know which direction to take, you may not even know your purpose on this universe, don't hesitate to search for a mentor to guide you. The goal of a mentor is to help you become better, not to try to make you something you are not. There are focus areas; strength, temperament, tract record, passion, choices, advice, support, esteem, encouragement, career. # GENERATIONAL CURSES

These are basically negative cycles in a lineage. It is like a chain father - child - grandfather - great grandfather. It's like running in a rilly. You give the stick to the next generation. Actually, the evil thing that follows your bloodline is a generational curse.

There is no bad condition in your life that is from nowhere. Even at times, a witch is a servant fulfilling a job in a generational curse cycle.

There are so many types of curses, but I can give an example of some. You find people in a family are barren they completely don't produce or they produce only one child, or in that family they produce four children in four men or they produce at 13 years or children in that family are raped Ladies and gentlemen if you are in that family you will not escape it will catch up with you.

Further more it can be in that family they commit suicide or in that family they die of accidents or they die of that moster called cancer or in that family they bury a relative in a certain month or in that family they don't go beyond 30 years. Man, you may try, and you survive, but trust me, your children will not, and if your children survives your grandchildren will not survive.

In some families, they are not supposed to marry or get married. I have seen people divorcing at 50 years or even failing at the beginning of the journey. People lose their spouse as soon as they get married or after a year or so in their marriage. You can marry or get married but living in a struggling marriage life and you are as if you are single, but still, in the end, it fails. Am not saying that marriages that fail are because of the generational curses but some. Generational curses exist.

In other developments, there are families where their own are not supposed to travel abroad. This is where you find they have denied that person visa like 10 times. It is so bad that even an aeroplane can crush because of you. Don't joke with generational curses

In that family people run mad at a certain age or in that family they are adulterous or in that family they are so poor they don't even manage to do business or they die in a certain month. My brothers and sisters don't think you are so special if you are from that family you will get your share.

There are so many causes of generational curses, but sin is a major one. Sins like serving other gods, shedding blood, witchcraft, adultery to mention but a few.
