RI PRESIDENT OCTOBER MESSAGE



A quarter of the Rotary year is now behind us. I am sure you are helping Rotary to grow more and do more. And I hope you have already done your part for the Each One, Bring One initiative by introducing one person to Rotary.

Do you ever think about your earliest days as a Rotarian? I often do — because those first moments of discovering the power of service shaped who I am today. When I joined my Rotary club, our efforts focused on India's rural communities, where people were living without toilets, getting their drinking water from the same pond they bathed in, and sending their children to outdoor classrooms set up under a tree. The nearest health care provider often was miles away — and the services were inadequate. But after Rotary clubs carried out some service projects, the villages had toilets, clean drinking water, a classroom for early learning, and a nearby health care center.

The spark that Rotary kindled within me forced me to look beyond myself and embrace humanity. It made service a way of life and led me to a guiding principle I still stand by: Service is the rent I pay for the space I occupy on Earth.

If you feel the need to reignite the spark of service in yourself or your club, October — Community Economic Development Month — is a great time to do so. When we work to improve the lives of people in underserved communities — through, for example, projects that provide vocational training and access to financial resources — we help build and sustain local economic growth.

The need is great. According to the United Nations, 9 percent of the world's population — that's 700 million people, a majority of them in sub-Saharan Africa — live on less than \$1.90 a day. By supporting strong community development as well as entrepreneurs, we can help improve conditions for people in that region and others.

Your club can also promote economic development in your own community by expanding vocational training opportunities through local schools and community colleges, partnering with lenders to improve access to financial services, or working with a nonprofit that provides resources to entrepreneurs and connects them with the business community.

Of course, developing strong communities is impossible without strong public health. On 24 October, World Polio Day, we'll celebrate our tremendous progress in the effort to eradicate polio. But we also know the fight is not over. We still need your help raising funds and awareness to ensure that all children are immunized against polio. Please don't forget to activate your clubs on that important day and encourage them to donate here: endpolio.org/world-polio-day.

Service has been rewarding for me throughout my life. I know the same is true for many of you. Join me this month in becoming a good tenant of our planet by helping others to better themselves and their communities. Together, we can Serve to Change Lives.

Sadly, this is some of our reality. We measure our progress and success with that of your friends, classmates and relatives with very limited information we have about them.

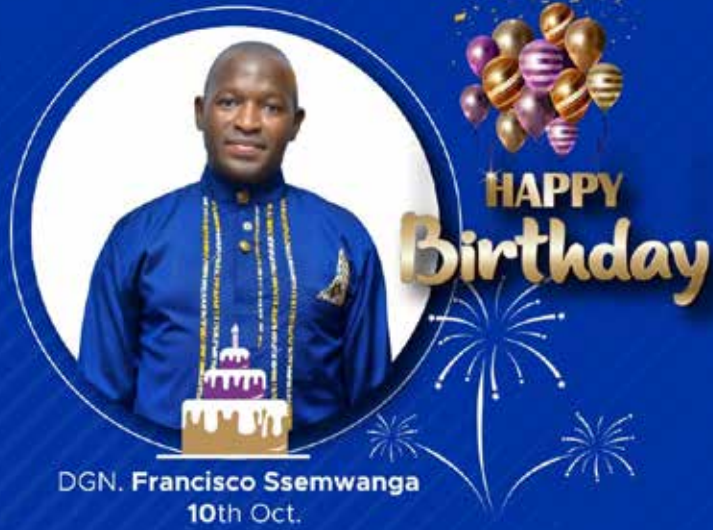

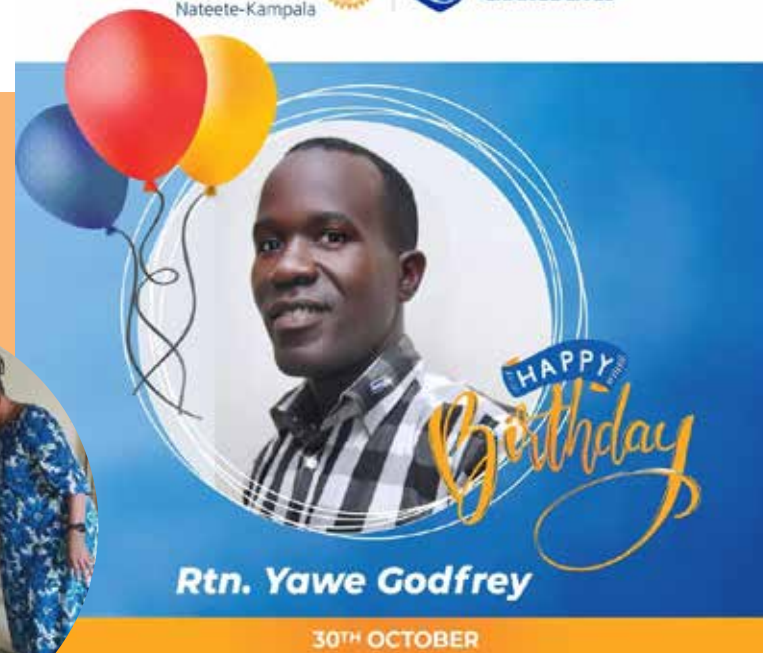

As- Salaam Alaikum

Greetings in the Name of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

Recognize important people in the meeting.....

All protocol observed, Good Morning,

My Name is ZZIMBE ZEPHANIAH, an advocate in the Republic of Uganda.

Today, I will tackle a topic of: GLOBAL CIVIL UNREST AND GANDHIAN PHILOSOPHY.

Briefly let me talk about Civil unrest also known as civil disturbance or civil disorder is an activity arising from a mass act of civil disobedience in which the participants become hostile towards the authority and authorities incur difficulties in maintaining public safety and order over the disorderly crowd. Such civil disobedience includes demonstrations, riots, strikes or ignoring laws.

According to U.S Code, a person is engaged in civil disorder if he or she teaches or demonstrates to any other person the use, application or making of any firearm or explosive or incendiary device or technique capable of causing injury or death to persons knowing or having reason to know or intending that the same will be unlawfully employed for use in or furtherance of civil disorder which may in any way or degree obstruct, delay or adversely affect commerce or the movement of any article or performance of any federally protected functions.

The causes of this civil unrest are many but let me mention a few which include political grievances, economic disparities, social discord but historically have been the result of long standing oppression by a group of people towards another.

Civil disorder arising from political grievances can include a range of events, from a simple protest to a mass civil disobedience. These events can be spontaneous, can also be planned. These events can turn violent when agitators and law enforcers overreact.

For instance from my country's history Uganda, the current President, His Excellence Yoweri Kaguta Museveni came into power through WAR and a lot of civil unrest was realized for he led a political movement called the NATIONAL RESISTANCE ARMY which fought against Milton Obote, the then President. This is proof that civil Unrest is historical and emanates from our forest date as we saw in the previous 2021 GENERAL ELECTIONS which led to injuries and death of many in the Capital of Kampala because of the differing political ideologies and the like.

This civil unrest runs down to even legislators in parliament for instance where there is a disagreement to a bill or law. For instance still in my country here Uganda, we had the TOGIKWATAKO SCENARION of the amendment of Article 121 (1) (b) of the 1996 Constitution of the Republic of Uganda. Members of our August Parliament were got out of order due to a lot of pressure and anger and ended up fighting and distorting parliamentary property. This too led to injuries and raised an exclamation of "IF OUR LEGISLATORS RESPOND OR RESPONDED ROWDLY AND VIOLENTLY TO SUCH A POLITICAL GRIEVANCE, WHAT ABOUT AN ORDINARY MAN IN THE KAMPALA SURBURBS?????" who desires to be heard and opinion respected but does not have platform.

Like mob participants, law enforcers are also susceptible to crowd behaviour. Such tense confrontation can emotionally stimulate them, creating highly emotional atmosphere all around. This emotional stimulation can become infectious throughout the law enforcement agents, conflicting with their disciplined training. Globally, I will take an example of the United states of America, the major and recent civil unrest scenarios which is the renown GEORGE FLOYD PROTEST around May 26, 2020 and up to date, this following the murder of George Floyd, protests and civil unrest against civil unrest and systematic racism began in Minneapolis and quickly spread across the whole United States of America and the whole world at large. I am not talking about such examples to bad image my country but to draw a clear picture of global civil unrest and compare it with THE GANDHIAN PHILOSOPHY.

The Gandhian ideology is the set of religious and social ideas adopted and developed by Mahatma Gandhi, first during his period in South Africa and later on in India. Gandhian philosophy is not only simultaneously political, moral and religious, it is only traditional and modern, simple and complex. It embodies numerous western influences to which Gandhi was exposed but it is rooted in ancient Indian Culture harnessing universal moral and religious principles.

The philosophy exists on several planes that is the spiritual or religious, political, economic, social, individual and collective. Secondly, human nature is regarded as fundamentally virtuous and lastly, all individuals are believed to be capable of high moral development and of reform. The main philosophies of the Gandhian philosophy are; Non- violence and truth, Economy, Satyagraha simply meaning holding firmly to the truth, educations system and decentralization in democracy.

My discussion will majorly base on NON-VIOLENCE AND TRUTH, ECONOMY AND DECENTRALISATION IN DEMOCRACY. Under Truth and non- violence, these are the twin cardinal principles of the Gandhian thoughts. For Gandhi, truth is the relative of truthfulness in word and deed and the absolute truth which is rather the ultimate reality. The ultimate truth is God and morality. Non-violence far from meaning mere peacefulness or the absence of overt violence is understood by Mahatma Gandhi to denote active love, the pole opposite of violence in every sense. Non- violence or love is regarded as the highest law of human kind. Gandhi said that "the truth is more powerful than any other weapon of mass destruction."

Gandhi stood for decentralization of both political and economic power which he believed is possible by only by beginning from bottom upwards and not vice versa. Gandhi believes in complete independence and that masses should become conscious of their capacity to regulate and control authority when it goes astray. He further states that it is not the government of the omnipotent state but the government of the people, by the people and for the people. It is democracy of the highest order for its guiding principle is equality and justice. He believed that true democracy is an outcome of un- adulterated non- violence.

In conclusion, Mahatma Gandhi's teachings hold relevance even today's world. The Gandhian philosophy is not only simultaneously political, moral and religious; it is also traditional and modern simple and complex. In today's scenario "an eye for an eye" is no solution as it only aggravates the situation. Peaceful co-existence, economic independence, respect for women, child centered education and basic education for everyone, universal brotherhood, all these principles should serve as a beacon of light to guide humanity for a better world we shall survive together or if we fail in our venture, we are bound to perish together. Gandhian philosophies and ideas seem to be the only solution to overcome the present ever growing civil unrest which is leading the world to a doomsday.
