## THANKS FROM WADEYE COMMUNITY N.T.

Immediate Past President Chris Bartlett received the following letter (via email) of thanks from the Palngun Wurnangut Association Inc, Wadeye Northern Territory following our recent donation of \$2000 to assist this indigenous community. As members will see our donated funds will be well spent assisting the selected projec

Dear Chris,

I am writing to thank you for your recent generous donation of \$2,000 which will fund a comprehensive energy audit for our organisation.

The Northern Territory has the highest electricity charges in the country and Wadeye's electricity station is diesel powered. Not only very expensive, it is also an inefficient way to produce electricity and environmentally unsustainable.

PWA's enterprises include a small art centre specialising in printed fabrics and a Kakadu plum processing plant that uses considerable power. Mi Marrarl, as the fruit is known locally, is a super food with a very high concentration of vitamin C and other beneficial properties. We have recently purchased a blast freezer and two freezer containers for the enterprise and our energy consumption has understandably spiked.

Scott and Lynn Jarman are our Mi Patha Takeaway and Bakery managers. They are doing an amazing job as this enterprise is our main source of income, funding many of our economic and community development initiatives. They constantly seek ways to reduce overheads while maintaining a quality service. They've expanded the business by extending the opening hours and improving the quality and range of products and have reopened the butcher shop that had been closed for some time. Soon we will have fresh seafood flown in from Darwin once a week – a real treat for the community.

The energy audit will show where our consumption is and, importantly, provide possible strategies to reduce our costs and environmental footprint. Any cost reductions will allow PWA to invest in more community infrastructure and initiatives.

Thank you again for your support and we'll let you know the outcome when the audit is completed.
