AUSTRALIA- BUILT ON THE SHEEP'S BACK- A STORY OF LUCK, INNOVATION & FOLLY



Our Guest speaker Professor Kevin Atkins, was an excellent guest speaker, and was accompanied by wife Ellila

Our Guest Speaker on Thursday night, Professor Dr Kevin Atkins from Shoal Bay drew a good number of guests to our meeting. Kevin's talk on the history of the Australian Sheep and Wool Industry was both informative and entertaining.

The Sheep Industry in Australia was founded by John Macarthur in the early 1800's and was the foundation for Australia's early growth as a nation. The introduction of the Merino sheep aided this growth. Kevin, explained the different quality of wools, how wool competes with other fibres, and that Australia supplies nearly 80% of the world's wool. The peak price for wool at one stage was \$30 a kilo, compared to \$8kg today.

He highlighted some of the challenges the industry has faced over 2 centuries, including the oil crisis of the last century, the introduction of the Vermont Merino which produced less wool and more grease and rabbits.

Kevin concluded his talk with a video on the innovations taking place in the Industry where sheep are now genetically bred for either meat or wool. New technology is leading the way and the scope for improvement is "unlimited". Club members and guests certainly enjoyed the evening, with Kevin proving an entertaining speaker.
