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BOARD MEETING UPDATES

The Club's new Board met for the first time in our "inspirational Year", with 3 new faces in Chelsea Ellul, Liz Friend and John Sully joining President Kathy, VP John Stuhmcke, Secretary Don Whatham,, Treasurer Ian Brigden, President Elect Arja Levonpera and Chris Bartlett.

Our Club had a very successful year in 2017/18 highlighted by the very successful District Conference of now PDG Helen Ryan at West Diggers in March. All our traditional activities were successfully carried out, with our community profile on the rise. President Kathy will lead us again this year in similar style, encouraging participation with our sponsors and supporters. The Board made several decisions regarding traditional aspects of a first meeting of the new Rotary year including the confirming of Honorary members and the appointment of the Club Auditor. These will be announced on confirmation back to Secretary Don. A HELPING HAND FOR KOBY

Member Milton Williams submitted a request (below) to the Club Board for consideration regarding his neighbour Koby Poole. The Poole family require an additional \$2500 to purchase a specialised chair for Koby to improve his quality of life. The Board reviews each case on its merits and express thanks to Milton for bringing this particular request to the Club. The Board felt that Koby's parents have done so much for their son, in what is to be a lifetime of care. Other business, especially Soldiers Point Bowling Club, local business and the community have all assisted. The Board, on behalf of you, our members, will provide the Poole family with the \$2500 requested for Koby's new chair. Milton was able to those members present on Thursday night a glimpse into Koby's life and thanking the Club for supporting his request. Koby's parents are an inspiration for us all with the love and care provided to their son.

Attached is some documentation regarding Kody Poole who is the son of our next door neighbour. We have only been here a short time and when I meet our neighbours for the first time I was lost for words, it is a tragic story. The parents have a huge task to look after Kody 24/7 with o days off. They are an amazing couple who have had to adjust their lives and also the house to enable them to look after Kody. The task to look after Kody will never change or improve unless they can source specialised equipment, all items are very expensive. Given Kody's disability they have had to source a special vehicle which was donated by Soldiers Point Bowling Club and required another \$40,000 to convert the vehicle with specialised hydraulics. They have achieved this through "Crowd Funding" up to 50% and the NDIS has now advised they will support it dollar for dollar so now they can have the vehicle modified for a wheelchair. Kody is too heavy to lift in and out as he has no muscle strength. Brodie, his mother currently has back problems from an epidural 18 months ago. I have attached a note below describing the specialised chair and some photos of Kody. As a side note we bought Kody a remote controlled car last week and it is the first time I have seen him smile. Kody has no muscle use to be enable to control the car which has to

manoeuvred by his father but he knows it is his car, something he can put in his room. Anyway would appreciate consideration by the board for this fund raising request of \$2500. Milton Williams

KOBY POOLE

Koby was born on the 4.10.08 a healthy happy baby. At 18months of age, things changed with Koby. He lost his balance and wasn't acting like a normal two year old. We took Koby to the John Hunter and spent months in hospital. At two, Koby was fully disabled in a blink of an eye, our son was gone. Koby suffered a rare and large swelling from a highly rare virus that affected the basil ganglia in his brain. This then meant that due to the area that was damaged Koby now has very high dystonia, level five movement disorder that doesn't enable him to talk. Clinical name: Dystonic Cerebral Palsy

This is just a small fraction of our story. Koby is now turning 10 this year. This young man has beaten the odds and trialled countless medications and has gone through minor surgeries to receiving Botox every 4 months (14 injections / treatment on the day) Nothing seems to calm his movements down .Kobe was originally through the enable funding body .Due to changes in the government funding the last few years, change of department, Koby's needs have been not been addressed until recently and effectively has put his physical needs behind. The proposed chair allows Kobe to have the freedom and comfort but also the posture support he needs a.wheelchair, his high movement disorder the wheel chair is restrictive.

Because of Koby's movement disorder, he is unable to sit in his wheelchair for long periods of time, needs breaks frequently. A suitable chair allows Koby to sit upright, improve his respiratory function, recline and more importantly engage visually with family members. A suitable chair will be functional for him until approx. 16 years of age. Currently he is sitting in an upright position on a lounge with support from pillows.

Koby is unable to lay down for long periods due to gastric reflux and the danger of inhaling gastric contents into his lungs. We have written this hoping to receive a helping hand in achieving this for our son Koby. Our current financial status requires another \$2,500 for the chair.

Because of NDIS and the delays, we have pushed ourselves in asking the community and challenging ourselves to do fundraising in achieving the equipment that Koby so muchly deserves and needs to keep him up to point with his disability.

This chair for Koby will give him a break from being constantly positioned. This is our story, thank you for your time to listen.
