The Short Term Youth Exchange program for year 10 students to New Zealand was advertised in the local paper last week and we will support any applicant.

Liz Friend Community Service Assistant Director to Chris reported that we would assist with Australia Day activities and



were awaiting a response from the Australia Day committee accepting our offer to participate. We have offered to help with catering food, chips and drinks only this year as our extended management and organizational role had become too much for many of our members. Discussions with Port Stephens Council have been very positive and we will extend our activities at Gan Gan Lookout We are in the process of arranging workplace training by the council to allow our members to complete certain horticultural tasks. A suggestion was made that we may be able to include International President Ian Riseley's goal of planting a tree on behalf of every Rotarian.

President Kathy reported on behalf of Club Director Geoff that several exciting club meetings are planned. An attempt will be made to obtain guest speakers according to the Rotary monthly theme. Some excellent speaker and vocational visit suggestions were provided by members in last week's survey, Geoff will follow up the suggestions. The suggestion to have a member investigate a Rotary topic and prepare a presentation to the club was approved as was that of experienced Rotarians telling of

their Rotary and vocational experiences. Planning for the night for Larry is well advanced. This will be a fun and social night with lots of dancing. Funds may be used to provide a book on our Planet's preservation (a topic close to Larry) to a young person as a legacy in memory of Larry. Kathy also reported that four new members will soon be inducted to the club and several others are likely later in the year. Richard Turner a long term membership committee member encouraged us all to seek suitable prospective Rotarians and invite them along to club meetings. He did however stress the need to follow the correct protocol. The club's guidelines in proposing new members will be made available to members. President Kathy spoke enthusiastically of the plan to upgrade our club website and commence a Facebook page. Our new younger members will assist her in this process and at later club meeting sessions will be devoted to guiding some of our less tech savvy members in the use of available technology including club runner, RI, Club and District websites.

A FINAL WORD ON THE ROTARY INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION.

I hope you have enjoyed my observations from the International Convention which Fiona and I attended in Atlanta recently. One speaker who really made an impression on me was Brittany Arthur whose presentation was a highlight of the convention. She kept the audience approaching 40,000 spellbound and gained a standing ovation.

Her presence, personal qualities and contribution demonstrated clearly the skills, knowledge and experience that young people can gain through Rotary. Such people become future leaders and ambassadors for peace in our World.

"The highlight of the final day was the address by Brittany Arthur a young Australian now living in Germany and currently president of the Berlin Rotaract Club. She first became aware of Rotary as the friend of a fellow student at her school, a Japanese Rotary youth exchange student. At the completion of her schooling and whilst at University she successfully applied for a Rotary Ambassadorial Scholarship. Her study took her to Japan and later Germany. During her time as an Ambassadorial Scholar she visited many Rotary meetings. She was perceptive enough to see the need for change in the way Rotary conducts its business and meetings. To attract younger Rotarians who are part of the technology age and who are time poor, meetings need to change. There is a need for more efficiency, less time and greater embracing of technology. I found the presentation excellent and reflective of the direction we are hopefully heading at the Nelson Bay Club".
