Last Thursday week, 6th August, District Governor David Roach and wife District Governor Elect Amanda Roach joined us via Zoom to present the DG's vision for the year ahead.

Report Summaries:

President. Liz Friend

- Club remains hopeful of holding Golf Day but alternative fund-raising being considered.
- Club Development Plan completed.
- Suggestion that members make a monthly contribution to keep funds coming in.
- DG David Roach Is looking for contributions of Club history to add to an exhibition celebrating 100 years of Rotary in Australia.
- DG David has also asked we consider connecting with a Victorian Club. Perhaps a joint Zoom meeting.
- Club has been reminded of obligation under Child Protection Legislation.

Administration (incorporating Vocational) Phill Smith.

- At time of Board meeting, dinner meetings at the NBBC were still not possible, however the Club have now confirmed that we can hold meetings subject to restrictions that apply to their bistro. i.e. on arrival members proceed to their table where they must stay for the entire meeting. In other word no mingling before or afterwards. (I'm pretty sure we can go to the bar for drinks).
- Speakers have been confirmed for 20th and 27th August, 3rd September and 1st October. We also have three other speakers lined up as 'face to face' speakers. No vocational outings are contemplated at this time.
- Simplified risk assessment forms are being considered in conjunction with our Insurance Officer Helen Imienionek.

- A new membership Mapping Process to start September. It will include topics such as identifying, inviting, proposing, inducting and <u>positive</u> mentoring.
- Member satisfaction survey. All members should have received email. Please respond so results can be collated and presented to Club.
- Logo on Club documentation being updated.
- Scholarship Trust document being reviewed and Clubs previous commitment to funding to be assessed.
- New potential Corporate Membership (name withheld for privacy reasons) and 2 new prospective members also in pipeline.
- Suggest a list of our sponsors be compiled and members asked to support them. Also consider promoting by acknowledging their sponsorship through our website/Facebook.

International Arja Levonpera

• Little happening on the International front for obvious reasons. We are continuing with the KIVA loans program which Chelsea Ellul has agreed to co-ordinate.

Community Milton Williams

• Yacaaba Centre have requested some assistance with electrical work. Doug Craike happy to do work. Suggest we use some of Bunnings Vouchers to pay for equipment. On an ongoing basis the centre will need maintenance and it is suggested we keep in touch and provide what we can.

- Council have considerable grant funds for Community projects. Suggest perhaps Gan Gan update of signs, Upgrading of facilities at Neil Carroll Park. Any thoughts?
- Suggest bus shelter advertising project be deferred. Although considered a worthwhile, income producing investment the current circumstances do not lend themselves to asking locals to spend money on advertising.
- Milton keeps contact with Mayor Ryan Palmer and will ask if there are any projects he considers worthy of our involvement.
- Team feel strongly that local community should be #1 priority and we need to look at income opportunities to make up the lost income from Bunnings, Golf Day and the like.

Youth Lesley Freeman

- School equipment received from Parramatta Public School delivered to schools at Shoal and Anna Bay as well as Out of School Hours Care at Tomaree Community College.
- Roadwhyz is unlikely to take place this year as school excursions are frowned upon at present. The possibility of holding separate events at each school is being investigated, but even this is no certainty.

In General

- Interact President Liz, Helen and Lesley to approach local schools to initiate discussion about Interact. Lesley has spoken to Tim Smith (PCYC) who expressed some interest.
- Club history there is considerable documentation at the Rotary shed much of which appears irrelevant. It is suggested a group go through same to remove irrelevant items.
- Minutes three have been complaints by some that they are not being kept up-to-date with Board decisions. To address this it was agreed that "draft" minutes would be posted in the "Members Area" of Clubrunner. These should appear within a couple of days of the Board meeting.
- Constitution and Bylaws must be reviewed and adopted at the club's AGM on 10 December 2020.

Jones will officially become president-nominee on 1 October if no other candidates challenge her.


