In one Greek café John was welcomed by the owner whose most important guests prior to him were former

Prime Ministers Tony Abbott (Australia) and Roger Harper (Canada). A highlight of the trip for John who has been a wonderful supporter of the Rotary Youth Exchange program for our club was the meeting in Barcelona with Johanna Stolch (exchange student 2013). Johanna travelled down from her home in Munich, Germany to spend a few days with her Rotary family the Cropleys. Hanna and Emma were very excited being able to spend time with their "big sister'. Rotary is a wonderful organization allowing such opportunities to interact with members of our Rotary family. Youth exchange has initiated many ongoing, lasting relationships.

Club historian, Richard Turner gave an overview of another Rotary highlight, Australian Rotary Health. ARH has been an Australian Rotary program for 35 years. During this time it has funded over \$36M of medical research. ARH is the largest funding body for medical research in Australia outside the Federal Government. Since 2000 the main focus has been on mental health research as this was seen as an area largely overlooked by other providers. The focus now is more specifically on the mental health of young Australians. In addition ARH provides funding for a broad range of general health areas, provides and scholarships for rural medical and nursing students as well as indigenous health students. PDG Don Whatham has been involved with ARH as a co-ordinator, board director and vice chairman. He was made a life member in 2014 and continues his work for ARH as an ambassador.

## PAUL HARRIS FELLOWS.

Tonight former Rotarian, friend of our club and outstanding Rotary Foundation supporter Narelle Meluish was presented with a Paul Harris Sapphire pin. Narelle is a multiple Paul Harris awardee in acknowledgment of her generous donations to the Foundation over several years. The Rotary Foundation is the charitable arm of Rotary and is responsible for the work we do locally, nationally and internationally to promote health, alleviate hunger and support humanity. A Paul Harris Fellowship recognises an individual who contributes or in whose honour is contributed \$US1000 to the Foundation. Thank you Narelle. Your generosity is sincerely appreciated.



Geoff Diemar introduced Kelvin Kong who was also awarded a Paul Harris Fellowship by our club.

Kelvin a former Shoal Bay Public School and Nelson Bay High School student was recognized for his achievements in medicine and voluntary service to the community. He completed his Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery at the University of NSW in 1999. He embarked on his internship at St. Vincent's Hospital in Darlinghurst and pursued a surgical career, completing resident medical officer and registrar positions at Westmead Hospital, John

Hunter Hospital, Gosford District Hospital, Prince of Wales Hospital and the final year of his training completed at St. Vincent's Hospital. He has served the rural community as part of secondments to peripheral hospitals. He is now a qualified Surgeon specialising in Adult & Paediatric Otolaryngology, Head & Neck Surgery (Ear, Nose & Throat Surgery), being Australia's first (and currently only) Aboriginal Surgeon.

Associate Professor Kelvin Kong is currently a consultant ear nose and throat surgeon practising in Newcastle. He is Visiting Medical officer (VMO) at John Hunter Hospital and John Hunter Children's Hospital and VMO surgeon at Newcastle Private Hospital, and Hunter Valley Private Hospital. He is Conjoint Associate Professor at the University of NSW and Conjoint Lecturer at the University of Newcastle.

He attends Awabakal clinics at Hamilton, Tabwabba clinics at Forster, Biripi Clinics at Taree and Armajun Clinics at Tamworth. In addition to these regular clinics he takes annual 10 day visits to the Kimberley region and Broome in Western Australia to take his expertise and treatments to isolated Aboriginal communities.

In 2014-15 he assisted the treatment of hearing difficulties in four young children nominated by our club. He has also assisted other Rotary medical initiatives in a voluntary capacity.
