Our speaker tonight was Dean McCarthy Secretary Manager of Nelson Bay Bowling Club.

With Nelson Bay Rotary's 26 year association with the Bowling Club, members were keen to hear of the progress of current renovations and future plans of the Club.

Dean came to the Club in September 2014 having been born and bred in Port Macquarie where he commenced work at the RSL Club.

16 years later he moved to Forster and then Griffith Leagues Club before moving to Nelson Bay in September 2014.

Deans first task was to oversee the complete renovation of two greens and the improvement of a third.

The Club is setting up to have the best greens in the district and were awarded the task of holding the recent Grade 1, 2016 NSW State Pennant Finals which were held from July 30^{th.}

Recent renovations provide for a new entertainment forum including a dance floor with overhead speakers directing music to those who want to hear it without blasting the ears of those nearby who want to sit and chat. (Something those of the editor's generation can appreciate).

Dean is proud of his industry. NBBC employs around 40 staff, has 200 bowlers and 6000 members and puts back into the community around \$85,000 by way of direct and indirect donations.

14,000 NSW Clubs employ more than 41,000 staff, and have 44,000 volunteers and provide facilities including 719 Bowling greens, 353 Golf Courses, 100 tennis courts as well as football and other sporting fields for 5.7 million members.

From the Archives. Since formation Nelson Bay Rotary have had only two permanent meeting places. The Club met at the Country Club Hotel Shoal Bay until 1990 when we moved to the Bowling Club. Historian Richard Turner reports that dress codes were very formal in the early days but along with community attitudes have relaxed in recent times. Consumption of alcohol in moderation was introduced in 1970 and continues today.



Centenary of The Rotary Foundation - 2016

At the 1917 convention, outgoing Rotary President Arch Klumph proposed to set up an endowment "for the purpose of doing good in the world." In 1928, it was renamed The Rotary Foundation, and it became a distinct entity within Rotary International.

Growth of the Foundation

In 1929, the Foundation made its first gift of \$500 to the International Society for Crippled Children. When Paul Harris died in 1947, contributions began pouring in to Rotary International, and the Paul Harris Memorial Fund was created.

Evolution of Foundation programs

1947: Fellowships for Advance Study, later known as Ambassadorial Scholarships were introduced.

1965-66: Three programs were launched: Group Study Exchange, Awards for Technical Training, and Grants for Activities in Keeping with the Objective of The Rotary Foundation, which was later called Matching Grants. 1978: Rotary introduced the Health, Hunger and Humanity (3-H) Grants. The first 3-H Grant funded a project to

immunize 6 million Philippine children against polio.

1985: The **PolioPlus** program was launched to eradicate polio worldwide.

1987-88: The first peace forums were held, leading to Rotary Peace Fellowships.

2013: New **district**, **global**, **and packaged grants** enable Rotarians around the world to respond to the world's greatest needs.

For Consideration: 1. Bruce Allen of Australian Rotary Foundation Trust has suggested that Clubs in this part of the world nominate up to 5 Community Leaders for Paul Harris Fellow recognition during the month of November. Club Foundation Director Phill Smith proposes to put this to the Board for adoption. We have for many years had an excess of PHF "credits", so would not require additional fund raising. However, it could be a great promotion for Rotary locally and nationally.



We can't guarantee **immortality** but a donation to Foundation's Permanent Fund will be a gift that keeps giving forever. These funds are invested and the interest allows Rotary to cover its administrative costs ensuring that (almost) 100% of donations go to the

stated need. A donation of \$100 dollars will give you bragging rights to an "immortal" badge. Worth it just for the badge. Phill will also be promoting this initiative during the year.
