## A world where every woman, man and child leads a healthy, fulfilling life of self-reliance and dignity.



One of our most recent members, Alicia Cameron told us in her maiden presentation all about her quest to raise \$10,000 for the Hunger Project. The money is not going to be spent on just buying food for starving people but for projects to

help people change their prospects for the future permanently. The aim of "The Hunger project is to unlock their capacity, creativity and leadership so they can end their own hunger.

Alicia wants more than just raise money: she want to see with her own eyes how the money is spent and contribute to the project with her leadership skills to empower women in hunger stricken countries to solve their local problems and create a better future for themselves and their children.

Alicia applied to be one of 20 people who take on fundraising (minimum \$ 10,000). By reaching this target she will be able to join other Business Chicks leaders on a 7 day immersion program in Senegal. There she will see how a village with no resources, no electricity or access to basic food and medical assistance can move towards a thriving sustainable and self reliant community.

To raise the \$10.000 (minimum!) Alicia runs several sub projects. More information on how you can contribute on the next page of this bulletin. She should have the money together by the 15th December 2017 and will fly out to Dakar on the 6th of February next year.

Lots of success, Alicia with your project, that fits nicely with The 3-H of Rotary: Hunger, Health and Humanity.

### WHY MORE FUNDING?

worldwide from 350,000 cases in 1988 to 223 cases — an all-time low — in 2012, our work is still not finished.

#### THE RISK

Lack of funding will decrease immunization rates in polio-affected everywhere, no unvaccinated child is safe **anywhere**. If polio rebounds, more than 200,000 children worldwide could be paralyzed each year within a decade
