# Research Provides Hope for Sufferers of Motor Neurone Disease

The devastation of having a loved one diagnosed with Motor Neurone Disease (MND) is something that we don't hear about very often. What makes MND so devastating is that the cause is unknown, it is difficult to diagnose, and there is no known cure.

Australian Rotary Health is one charity funding research into MND, with <u>Hannah Suddull</u> from Macquarie University being one of the most recent PhD scholarship recipients to focus on this area.

Youth Director Lesley Freeman visited the PCYC on Thursday and met with Dan Howard, who is well known to our Club and Community Constable Tim Smith to get an update on PCYC activities. Dan has been appointed NSW Under 15 Development Squad Basketball Coach for the next 12 months. October 10 or anytime during Mental Health Month in October.


