COVID TIP OF THE WEEK





Thursday night's Zoom meeting saw Lee Christian from the Australian Cancer Research Fund a return visit to our Club.a presentation in 2016. This year's Zoom presentation n was very comprehensive with our members gaining an excellent update on what is happening in the area of Cancer research. We had a special guest in Lyn Moffitt for the evening, partner of former Club member the late Larry McGrath. Lyn has been a long supporter of ARCF for many years, have lost several family members along with Larry to Cancer. ACRF was set in 1984 by Sir Peter Abels and Lady Sonia McMahon, who had in 2 years had ser up a grant of \$1,000,000 dollars. Now with a team of 20 fundraisers a total of \$165 million has been raised for grants into Cancer research in Australia including 2 x \$10 million grants which may make significant difference in treatment to cancer patients. Lee presented some very telling statics regarding various types of cancer with

Australia unfortunately leading the world in skin cancers and melanoma. Early detection is the key to better outcomes. She also mentioned that dogs can detect whether a woman has breast cancer, and again stressed early dectection where possible, ACRF's research has enabled a vaccine which helps prevent cervical council.

In summing up Lee mentioned the two major appeals which are conducted in June and Xmas each year, while other events can be arranged by individuals. There some slides on page 4 of the B ulletin and comprehensive information is available on the ACRF website, which is easily accessible. 
