

# Bulletin 10 – 1 September 2022KEITH HOBBSPORT STEPHENS FRIENDSHIP GROUP.



Keith Hobbs arrived in Australia from England in 1959. Keith began his presentation by commenting on the massive contrast in Australia between then and now. One of his first recollections of Australia in 1959 was a trip to Surfers Paradise which had its wonderful beach but the residentials consisted mainly of tin shacks. Think of the massive highrise of today. Keith has worked in the building construction industry throughout his life and still dabbles in the trade at 85 years of age. He first came to the Bay to visit children and grand children and was so impressed with the location that he settled here and travelled back to Sydney to work till his permanent retirement.

After retirement, three years ago, Keith saw an advertisement for the Port Stephens Friendship Group and decided to pay a visit. Thus began what Keith describes the beginning of a wonderful association with like minded older community

members who have since become close friends and travelling companions. The sole purpose of the group is friendship. It does not aim to raise funds, its sole purpose is to provide friendship by participating in friendly activities. The non-profit group currently has 80 members aged from 55 years to 95 years. Only four committee meetings are held per year primarily to plan the annual activities.

Activities which are very popular with members include visits to restaurants, coffee days, social bowling, theatre excursions, walking trips, happy hours and barbeques, day trips to local points of interest and industries, trots nights and longer excursions. The longer bus trips have included visits to Coonabarabran to the space facility and the Warrumbungles, South Coast and Central West including a bus experience around Mt Panorama at Bathurst.
