The Trek4Kidz is an annual event in which he and his son participate every year.

The proceeds of this charity event and moneys raised are a donation to the *Starlight* Children's Foundation. Last years rally for example raised a donation of \$240,000. The current donation barometer stands so far at \$152,000 and still counting.

This year's Trek started in Port Macquarie, on to Tamworth, Tenterfield and Toowoomba. A well-earned rest day in Toowoomba is used for more fundraising before the trip takes to Moree, Dubbo and finish in Goulburn.

Unlike previous events that had challenging stretches with mud baths and slippery dirt outback roads, this year they witnessed the devastation the extensive draught is causing.

From 22 vehicles at start all but one finished. The one car involved in an incident whereby they hit a tree and unfortunately resulted in a write-off.

The total Trek for the week was 3,500km and the calculation is a simple math:

First and last car times recorded and averaged.

The car closest to the average is the winner of the day.
