Real Futures aims to promote:

"A Port Stephens community in which schools, businesses and community members work together to assist all young people to transition from school to meaningful employment".

And their mission is to:

"Work closely with Port Stephens schools and their communities to implement responsive initiatives that support and motivate all young people, in particular those in most need, to engage fully in education, training and meaningful employment".

The Foundation is sponsored by local businesses.

Students that are struggling academically (or just not interested in school) are given the opportunity to work outside the school framework with individual programs matched to them. Showing an interest in their future gives these students a heightened sense of self-worth and they respond positively resulting in moving into a career after school rather than welfare.

The Foundation provides programs that build communication skills, confidence and self-worth, highlight career opportunities and develop leadership, interview and basic financial skills.

Marian asked to mention their upcoming Golf Day at Horizons on 18th October where a \$50,000 hole-in-one is offered.



World Mental Health Day is only 4 weeks away and that's when Australian Rotary Health will be celebrating Hat Day as part of its national Lift the Lid on Mental Illness fundraising campaign.

You can get involved with your friends, colleagues or Rotary Club this year by hosting a Hat Day on Thursday
October 10 or anytime during Mental Health Month in October.

Your support will help the 1 in 5
Australians who suffer a mental illness every year. 100% of funds raised will go towards vital mental health research at universities across Australia.

This year's DG's Partner's Project is Integra Service Dogs.

They train dogs as companion dogs for Defence Force Veterans and First Responders suffering Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSN).

Studies have shown dogs can help reduce anxiety and depression, as well as the symptoms of PTSD, which is why they are commonly paired with veterans.

It costs around \$30,000 to train and match a dog and our Club will do its bit to promote the project in conjunction with our mascot "Nelson":
