Kathy after her successful career in the Greater Bank Newcastle started her own business, Ying Yang Consulting. When in June last year an opportunity as Financial Literacy Coordinator by the University of Newcastle was offered, she accepted.

Studies shows the financial literacy and financial habits in young Australians needed to be improved. Furthermore, it was found that men to have higher financial literacy, but women have better financial habits.

The Finance Academy was created in 2018.

Since 2019 approx. 3700 students from 78 schools have been put through this programme. The curriculum was developed in cooperation with the Greater Bank and UNI Newcastle.

Gen Z UNI student ambassadors are trained to deliver one of the lessons to the High School students as paid casuals, being more attractive and a welcome change from teachers and parents. Another lesson is delivered by a Greater Bank ambassador, the rest of the lessons are teachers lead with content that is aligned to the Australian Curriculum for Years 9, 10 and 11. The program is free and has ready-to-

Australian Curriculum for Years 9, 10 and 11. The program is free and has ready-torun resources, which is a welcome and accepted formula, making is easy for teachers and schools with limited resources.

There are four 45 min. modules:

- Intro to Financial Literacy
- Fundamentals
- Saving & Budgeting
- Credit, Debt & Banking

43% of young people (18-24 years) reported that they could not meet their personal debt obligations.*

Mastering personal finance skills and behaviour is the key to ensuring future independence and success, not only in their finances but in overall life satisfaction.

This education starts at school.
