## Report from Meeting

The meeting was chaired by VP John this week. Here is a summary of some of the points discussed.

- 1. The club is still looking to fill the position of President for 2024 -2025. It is clearly very important if the club wishes to continue, that we address this problem prior to the AGM. Plenty of support will be available to the president from the other board members.
- 2. The provision of a new style of gift to guest speakers was discussed. In the past we have provided a Rotary pen. Some other ideas include providing a mug with Rotary details and acknowledgement thanking them for being a guest speaker. Another option is to provide a certificate which states we thank you for being a guest speaker and our club will now donate a certain amount to Polio Plus in its quest to rid the world of this disease.
- 3. The Club will agree to cater at the Camp Quality Christmas function at Tomaree Aquatic Centre on Sunday 26th of November. We will have the numbers to cover this event and use our Clive's Cooker BBQ.
- 4. The Yacaaba Centre made a request to add donations to a Christmas Hamper appeal they are running. At this time we resolved to support them through our \$600 a month regular donation, but not further. Individual contributions would be welcome from any member who would wish to do so privately.
- 5. The Port Stephens Council run a scholarship program every year and have a a process to find suitable candidates. Our scholarship coordinators will look into whether this could also suit our purposes. We can stipulate the criterion which would want in any prospective recipient.

#### Closure of Garden Account

The garden project is now completed with only some minor items remaining.

A request has been made By Doug C. to finish the irrigation system and install some garden lights. It was decided that it was important to complete the irrigation system for the long term health of the plants and as it was part of the original plans. The club has received a number of gift cards from catering at Bunnings events. We hope we might be able to use some of these to pay any costs for these final items.

It was resolved we now close the garden account and return any surplus funds to our general service account.
