amphibious warfare training area of the Joint Overseas The Royal Australian Navy called its training establishment HMAS Assault, and the ships HMAS Westralia, HMAS Manoora, HMAS Kanimbla and USS Henry T. Allen were frequently in the port, along with more than 130 other vessels of varying sizes. The Westralia (a commandeered



civilian vessel) was used as temporary accommodation until shore facilities were built. Roger outlined the development of

HMAS Assault which consisted of many buildings including the main operation centre which became a community hospital and currently community arts centre following the war. It has been estimated that

about 2,000 allied troops a month passed through the training centre until it closed in October 1943. The troops learned the skills they would need to mount landings from amphibious craft. They made actual landings at such peaceful places as Zenith, Wreck and Box beaches.

Roger's interest extended to the gun placements and tunnels

- 1. An eye witness saw trucks coming and going into a tunnel.
- 2. Multiple eye witnesses played in air vet tunnels
- 3. Advised by US Navy of an underground Torpedo Maintenance Depot
- 4. Need for Secret Base to modify the US type 14 torpedo. 5. Large amount of andesite tailings on shore line
- 6. Road down to shore line from tunnel site
- 7. Large andesite rocks found with wedging drill marks
- 8. Artificial sand hill built to camouflage entrance
- 9. Large amount of hardened rock mix near entrance
- 10. Heavy duty power line leading to tunnel entrance
- 11. Large heavy duty rail wagon wheels used on jetty out to deep water
- 12. Photo of a submarine anchored off Fly Point

Bay. Roger has found significant evidence of the tunnels. He commented on the explorations of Charles Tennyson and Mark Rawson who were granted permission by Port Stephens Council to undertake archaeological investigations and begin excavating in the vicinity of a former defence site at

Fly Point in Nelson Bay. Roger cited the above incidents as evidence of the tunnels.

Roger on observing a school excursion exploring WW2 history in the area embarked on a study of local wartime activities of Australian and allied troops. At the peak of the Allied Pacific campaign in World War 2, more than 20,000 American and British troops were based in the Shoal Bay area of Port
