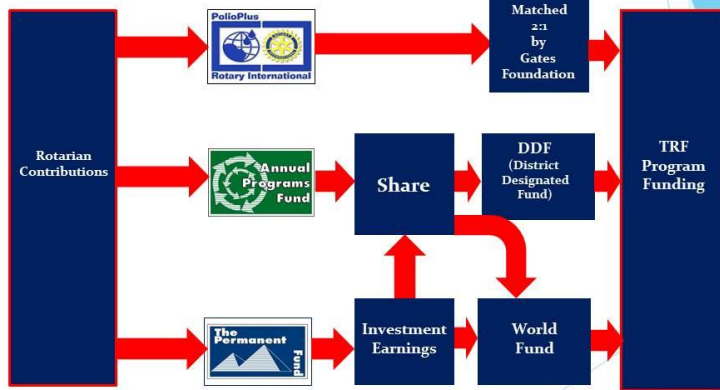

### Guest Speaker Jacky Gendre on Foundation Grants

#### The Rotary Foundation Money Flow



Jacky's presentation was to inform us of the inner workings of the Rotary Foundation and grants application processes. The Rotarian contributions are split 3 ways into PolioPlus, Annual Programs & Permanent Fund (Investment stream). PolioPlus is matched by the Gates Foundation 2:1. The Permanent Fund is the investment stream and used for admin costs etc.

The Annual Prog. Fund is divided up by 50% into the District Grants & Global Grants money which is invested for 3 years and portion of that then comes back to the District to be distributed.

Allocation is for 25 grants p/a, but this year alone 3x that was received.

The Grants Committee under chair of Peter Gaynor selects from the applications of which the club has to contribute 50%.

Grants up to \$30,000.- are approved and processed by the District. Projects of >\$30k need a Global Grants application, that is done on-line and is a very involved process. The District Committee will assist if a Global Grant is requested following the RI guidelines usually during a meeting in December and monies will become available in Feb.

In order to receive a grant one must demonstrate: 1) the need, 2) is wanted by the community, 3) provides local involvement, 4) must be a new project, 5) not for wages or accommodation buildings, 6) must be within the clubs capacity, 7) host RC involvement, 8) appoint responsible person for reporting. After this lecture we are all qualified to make grants applications. Thank you Jacky for an very informative presentation.
