Stephen Keating of Port Stephens Images Professional Photographer & Drone Pilot.

After spending many years working in film and TV as an editor and teaching TV production at TAFE, Stephen now concentrates his photography around the Bay. This week he told us about the rules and regulations for flying drones, the use of which has grown dramatically in many areas ranging from real estate photography and identification, to surf life saving, to fire control, to agriculture and many other areas requiring aerial surveillance and security.

Commercial drone pilots must be licenced which is costly and involves a fair amount time and study.

Recreational drone pilots do not need a licence, but still must comply with rules set by the Federal Aviation Administration.

These include restrictions relating to flying over people, flying in controlled air space, and flying beyond visual line-of-sight. General privacy rules must also be observed. Complaints regarding drones are investigated by Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA).

With Nelson Bay being so close to Williamtown RAAF Base we are subject to controlled air space restrictions. As a licenced pilot Stephen can fly in controlled air space but must log in and out when wanting to do so.

Stephen intended to show a selection of his work in his presentation but due to computer incompatibilities (ours not his) was unable to do so. Nevertheless his presentation was excellent and thoroughly enjoyed by all present who bombarded him with many questions. We hope to have Stephen back later in this Rotary year to talk some more about his profession and display some of his works. In the meantime you can view his work at:
